Advancement

The top 16 in each swimming event during Friday's prelims will return for competition on Saturday with the top eight individuals vying for state championship honors. Those finishing nine through 16 on Friday will make up the competitors in the consolation heats. All diving will take place on Saturday with the top 20 of 32 competitors advancing from the prelims to the semis after five dives each. After three dives each in the semis, the top 16 will advance to the final round for another three dives each.

■ Defending Girls Team Champion


Carmel is the 31-time defending state champion, the longest active string of state championships in the country in any sport or gender. See the next page for information on the nation's longest state championship streaks. Coach Chris Plumb, also the school's boys coach, has guided the Greyhounds to their last 11 girls titles, the most in state history.

■ Defending Individual State Champions

Three individuals return to defend their titles from a year ago. Yorktown junior **Emily Weiss** is the top seed in the 100 breaststroke (59.68) and is chasing her third consecutive

title in the race and would become the second swimmer in her school's history to be a three-time state champion. She set the state record in last year's event in 59.37. Carmel junior Kelly Pash is the defending champ in the 100 freestyle and is the top seed (49.39) in that event. She was also on two of the Greyhounds' winning relay teams last season. Teammate Trude Rothrock, a senior, won last year's 100 butterfly and enters the weekend with the second-fastest time (54.01). Rothrock owns six state championship medals, the most of anyone this weekend, having earned five of them as part of Carmel's relay teams the last three seasons. Another individual to watch is Homestead junior Jackie Brenn, who will compete in the diving competition. She won the event as a freshman in 2016 and finished as the runner-up last season.

■ Seventy-seven schools and 531 studentathletes have qualified for this weekend's event. Sectionals began last week with a 242 schools and 3,389 participants.

LAPORTE'S ROGER DOMBKOWSKI, SR. NAMED OUTSTANDING SWIMMING OFFICIAL

Roger Dombkowski, Sr. of LaPorte, IN is the recipient of the 2018 Interscholastic Athletic Official Award for excellence in the sport of swimming.

Each year, the Indiana High School Athletic Association, in cooperation



with the National

recognizes
and honors an
outstanding official
in each of 11 sports
during the school
year. Officials
selected for this

distinction have gone above and beyond to serve their association, community, and the IHSAA. Each have shown exceptional qualities of leadership, dedication, and loyalty to their sport, our student-athletes, and their fellow officials.

A graduate of Michigan City Elston, Roger continues to serve the Michigan City area school system. He has been a licensed IHSAA swimming official for 30 years, and during his time with the IHSAA he has worked 15 sectionals, three regionals and five state finals events. He is a member of the Hoosier Officials Association.

Roger was selected for this honor by a committee representing the official's associations. In Indiana there are 24 associations made up of men and women who give up much of their personal time to assist in providing wholesome, worthwhile, and healthy activities for the student athletes in our state. Statewide, there are more than 8,000 officials licensed by the IHSAA in 11 sports.

Roger has served as an IHSAA rules interpreter and clinician since 2010. A retired carpenter, Roger and his wife, Gloria (also a swimming official), have been married for 42 years. They have two children, Roger Jr. (39) and Ryan (38). In his spare time, Roger volunteers as a New Buffalo Little League Coach.

Sectional Streaks Snapped

South Bend St. Joseph ended Penn's string of 15 consecutive sectional titles at the South Bend Riley Sectional and Bedford North Lawrence supplanted 11-time winner Jasper during Jasper Sectional competition last Saturday. It was St. Joseph's 12th title overall and first since 2002. The Bedford girls won the crown for just the second time and first since 1979

representing the biggest drought-breaker among this year's sectional champions.

Approved requests may be claimed at the media will-call at the bottom of the stairwell leading to the pool entrance nearest the East Concourse. Please have proper identification available.

Media Work Area: Working space will be available to writers and photographers in the west bleachers of the Natatorium. Results from each event will be distributed and also posted to the IHSAA.org website as the meet progresses both days. Writers and photographers also will have access to the pool deck using the stairwell at the end of the West Concourse hallway.
