## Bump, Set, Kill: IHSAA Volleyball State Finals on Saturday

The hard-hitting, fast-paced action of the 43<sup>rd</sup> Annual IHSAA Volleyball State Finals will be under the spotlight Saturday including a defending state champion, two more that fell a step short last year and two others that have never reached this level of the tournament before.

The four state championship matches begin at 11 am ET at Ball State University's Worthen Arena in Muncie.

The opening match of the day features Class A top-ranked Wes-Del (34-3) and first-time participant #3 Christian Academy of Indiana (33-4).

The Class 2A final calls for defending state champion and top-ranked Providence (32-3) to face Southwood (26-13) which returns five years after its last visit to this match.

Second-ranked Fort Wayne Concordia Lutheran (31-6), which settled for last year's runner-up spot, will be challenged by No. 8 and first-time visitor Northview (36-3) for the Class 3A crown.

A third meeting between top-ranked Indianapolis Cathedral (32-4) and No. 5 Carmel (31-7) will decide the Class 4A state championship with each defeating the other during the regular season.

All four matches will be televised live by Fox Sports Indiana (FSI) and available as a live stream to those outside of the FSI coverage area at IHSAAtv.org. Greg Rakestraw, Mike Lingenfelter and Mark Jaynes will be the broadcast team for the Class A and 2A matches with Hall of Famer Jerry Baker joining Lingenfelter and Jaynes for 3A and 4A. The IHSAA will also be tweeting during the day at @IHSAA1.

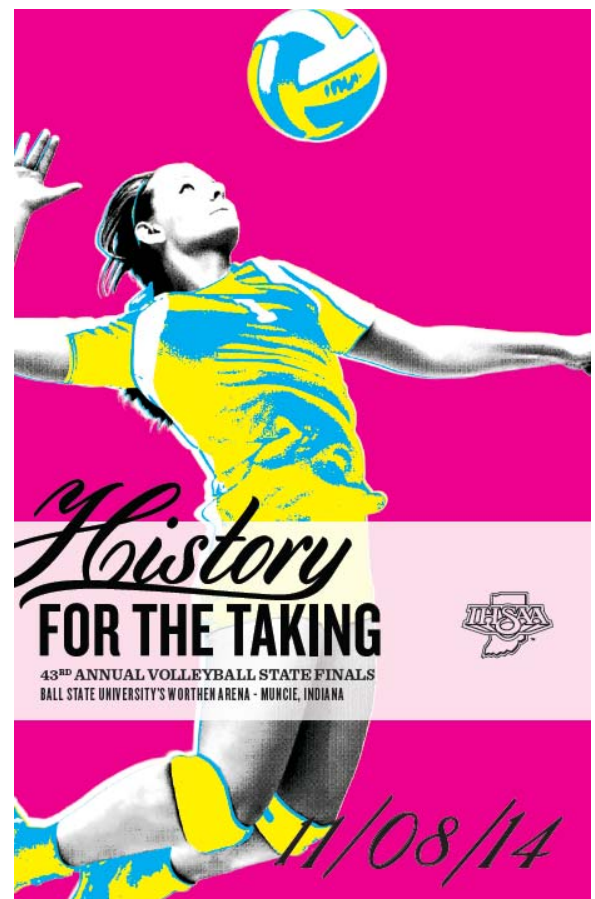

Interviews may be conducted with coaches and players following their matches though we request your cooperation in holding your interviews until after the award ceremonies have concluded. ## Dubois' Michael Zehr to be recognized as Outstanding Volleyball Official Saturday

Michael Zehr of Dubois is the recipient of the 2014 Interscholastic Athletic Officials Association Award for excellence in the sport of volleyball. Zehr will be honored in a special ceremony during Saturday's state finals.



Each year, the Indiana High School Athletic Association, in cooperation with the National Federation of Interscholastic Officials Association, recognizes and honors an outstanding official in each of 11 sports during the school year.

During his career, Mike has officiated 23 sectionals, 14 regionals, five semi-states, and three state finals. Zehr was selected for this honor by a committee representing the officials associations. In Indiana there are 24 associations made up of men and women who assist in providing wholesome, worthwhile, and healthy activities for the student athletes in our state. Statewide, there are more than 8,000 officials licensed by the IHSAA in 11 sports.

A licensed referee for 33 years, Zehr is a member of the Southwestern Indiana Officials Association, for whom he has served as a clinician. Mike also served as an IHSAA clinician for six years during the 2000s.

Mike Zehr is a 1972 graduate of Northeast Dubois High School. He is also a currently licensed baseball and basketball official, and has worked the state finals for each of his respective sports. Michael and his wife Marian have been married for 38 years and have two children: Alex (34) and Audra Caldwell (32).
