IHSAA Yearbooks, Handbooks now available on IHSAA.org

The IHSAA Yearbooks and Handbooks, annual publications containing the state tournament results in each sport dating back to the earliest years of the Association, are now available to the public on IHSAA.org.

The IHSAA published the books for 98 consecutive years and mailed them to member schools and public libraries throughout the state for decades. With the arrival of the IHSAA.org website in the late 1990s, the IHSAA ceased publishing the yearbook following the 2000-01 school year opting to post state tournament results solely on its website.

Each edition, beginning with the Association's first year in 1903-04, has now been scanned as a searchable PDF file and arranged by decade allowing individuals to research Indiana high school sports history. Membership lists, Association rules, by-laws and Board meeting minutes were also included in copies through the 1974-75 edition before they became a separate publication.



The file sizes range from 8 MB to as much as 63 MB so some may take additional time to download. The new webpage may be accessed by hovering over the "Resources" item at the top right (see photo above) and choosing "IHSAA Yearbooks & Handbooks" from the dropdown menu or use this direct link:

About the Indiana High School Athletic Association, Inc. (IHSAA)

The IHSAA is a voluntary, not-for-profit organization that is self-supporting without the use of tax monies. Since its founding in 1903, the Association's mission has been to provide wholesome, educational athletics for the secondary schools of Indiana. Its 410 member high schools - public, institutional, parochial and private - pay no annual membership fee or incur entry fees to play in the Association's tournaments. A state tournament series is conducted annually in 21 sports, 10 for girls, 10 for boys and one co-ed (unified track and field). A 19-person board of directors, elected by member school principals, governs the organization.
