State Finals Brackets via TrackWrestling.com | State Championship Records Book

Two hundred twenty-four (224) wrestlers in all, 16 in each of the 14 weight classes, will begin first round competition on Friday at 6 pm ET / 5 pm CT. First-round winners will return to wrestle on Saturday with quarterfinal action beginning at 9:30 am ET / 8:30 am CT and semifinal matches to follow after all weight classes have concluded. Consolation bouts begin at 5 pm ET and championship matches under the spotlight are scheduled for 7:30 pm ET.

Team scoring will begin with Friday night's preliminary matches. Scoring, per National Federation (NFHS) rules, will go to eight places and, additionally, two (2) advancement points will be awarded per match for a championship bracket victory while one (1) point is earned for advancement in the consolation bracket.

Finally, points will be awarded to the top eight place-winners: 1st place: 16 points; 2nd place: 12 points; 3rd place: 9 points; 4th place: 7 points; 5th place: 5 points; 6th place: 3 points; 7th place: 2 points; 8th place: 1 point.


■ Five defending or former state champions, including four seniors, are part of this year's field with the goal of adding a second state title to their resume this weekend.

Heavyweight Dorian Keys of Brownsburg (42-0) is one of 16 undefeated competitors this season after winning last year's big man weight class as a junior. Roncalli senior Alec Viduya (41-0) is unbeaten at 145 having won the 113 pound class as a freshman and finishing as runner-up last year at 132.

Other returning champs include: sophomore Jesse Mendez of Crown Point (36-1) at 132, last year's champ at 126; senior Elliott Rodgers of Indianapolis Cathedral (38-3) at 160, last year's champ at 152 and the 2018 runner-up at 152 and; senior Silas Allred (35-0) at 195, the defending champ in that class.

■ Defending State Champion

Indianapolis Cathedral is the two-time defending state champion after winning the school's third wrestling crown last year. The third-ranked Fighting Irish are coached by Sean McGinley and boast three semi-state champions of their nine participants this weekend.



NOTABLES

- One hundred thirteen (113) schools will be represented at this weekend's state finals with Evansville Mater Dei leading the way with nine qualifiers followed by Chesterton, Crown Point and two-time defending state champion Indianapolis Cathedral with eight each. Crown Point leads the state with five semi-state champions with Brownsburg, Chesterton, Evansville Mater Dei, Indianapolis Cathedral, Perry Meridian and Roncalli tallying three each. A total of 310 schools and 5,529 were entered into this year's state tournament at the sectional level.

MICHAEL GOLANDO NAMED OUTSTANDING WRESTLING OFFICIAL

The late Michael D. Golando of Valparaiso is the recipient of the 2020 Interscholastic Athletic Official Award for excellence in the sport of wrestling.

Each year, the Indiana High School Athletic Association, in cooperation with the National Federation of Inter-

scholastic Officials Association, recognizes and honors an outstanding official in each sport during the school year. Officials selected for this distinction have gone above and beyond to serve their association, community, and the



IHSAA. Each have shown exceptional qualities of leadership, dedication, and loyalty to their sport, our student-athletes, and their fellow officials.

Golando had been selected to be honored with this year's award before passing away unexpectedly in October.

Michael was the assistant wrestling

coach at Valparaiso University, an NCAA wrestling official, and a table worker at the Big Ten, MAC, and NCAA Wrestling Tournaments. He was a licensed official for 42 years, and had worked 38 sectionals, 25 regionals, 19 semi-states, and eight (8) state finals assignments. He was a member of the Calumet Officials Association, served as that group's vice president since 2014 and also volunteered for the IHSAA's Sportsmanship Task Force.

Golando was a 1977 graduate of Valparaiso High School and later graduated from the John Marshall Law School at the University of Illinois-Chicago in 2007.

Michael was selected for this honor by a committee representing the officials associations. In Indiana there are 24 associations made up of men and women who assist in providing wholesome, worthwhile, and healthy activities for the student athletes in our state. Statewide, there are more than 6,000 officials licensed by the IHSAA in 18 sports.



MEDIA CREDENTIALS: Deadline is Thursday, Feb. 20, 2020 at 4 pm ET / 3 pm CT. Please note that the 2019-20 IHSAA State Finals Media Credential will NOT allow admission to this event as a specific credential is required – no exceptions. Legitimate working news media should apply for credentials by e-mailing (with name of individual applying) IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at jwille@ihsaa.org. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: gmail.com, yahoo.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Approved requests will be left to claim by the individual (ID required) at media will-call at Bankers Life Fieldhouse beginning at 3 pm ET / 2 pm CT on Friday.

NO CHILDREN, PLEASE: With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

MEDIA PARKING: There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are numerous parking options within a short distance of Bankers Life Fieldhouse. The Virginia Street parking garage, which charges a fee, is directly to the east of the venue.

MEDIA ENTRANCE: The media entrance is in the southeast corner of Bankers Life Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Please allow a few extra minutes to pass through security. Media credentials left at will-call are to be claimed at this entrance beginning at 3 pm ET / 2 pm CT.

MEDIA WORK ROOM: The media workroom at Bankers Life Fieldhouse will be open both days and be available to working media members throughout Friday evening and all day on Saturday. The work area contains complimentary wireless internet access. Hospitality will be available.

WIRELESS ACCESS, ETHERNET LINES: Complimentary wireless service is provided for all attending media. Please access the "BLF Wifi" wireless signal. No login or password is required. Hard-wired Ethernet lines are available at cost by contacting Wendel Dunham (wdunham@pacers.com).

MAT ACCESS: During the championship round on Saturday night, credentialed photographers will be allowed to shoot action behind the A-frame sponsor ads on the east side (opposite the scorers table). Other than that, only participants, coaches, officials and fieldhouse workers will have access to the mat area.
