## Girls Basketball Tournament Tip-Off Show Airs Monday

The "IHSAA Tournament Tip-Off Show" will be televised on Monday (Feb. 1) beginning at 5:30 pm ET on Fox Sports Indiana just prior to the Indiana Pacers hosting the Cleveland Cavaliers at Bankers Life Fieldhouse. The show will run again following the post-game show at approximately 10 pm ET.

The one-hour program airs on the eve of the 41st Annual IHSAA Girls Basketball State Tournament presented by the Indiana Fever and Indiana Pacers. Highlights of many of the state's top 10 teams and players will be featured along with comments from representatives of 11 different schools.

The show also includes a special feature on Indiana's all-time girls scoring leader Jackie Young of Princeton who continues to add to her record point total. Indiana basketball legend and current Indiana Fever Head Coach Stephanie White narrates the piece. The television voice of the Pacers and Fever Chris Denari also sits down with IHSAA Commissioner Bobby Cox for his outlook.

Pacers Live Pregame/Postgame host Jeremiah Johnson will host with analysis provided by Columbus North Head Coach and Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Pat McKee.

The program will air again on Tuesday, Feb. 2 at 11 am ET and Wednesday, Feb. 3 at 2 pm ET on Fox Sports Indiana.

A similar show will air prior to sectional week of the IHSAA Boys Basketball State Tournament. Details for that program will be announced at a later time.

The IHSAA is a voluntary, not-for-profit organization that is self-supporting without the use of tax monies. Since its founding in 1903, the Association's mission has been to provide wholesome, educational athletics for the secondary schools of Indiana. Its member high schools - public, institutional, parochial and private - pay no annual membership fee or incur entry fees to play in the Association's tournaments. A state tournament series is conducted annually in 21 sports, 10 for girls, 10 for boys and one co-ed (unified track and field). A 19-person board of directors, elected by member school principals, governs the organization.
