Waldron fell to Frankfort, 37-31, in the first round of the 16-team IHSAA State Finals in 1927. All 15 games were played over two days at the Indiana State Fairgrounds in the Exposition Building, also known as..."The Cow Barn". It was the third and final year the finals would be played in the venue before moving to Butler Fieldhouse the next season. The 77 years between the two visits is the fourth longest span in tournament history. Martinsville, led by an 11th grader by the name of John Wooden, would go on to win the state championship that year.

Brownstown Central lost to Logansport, 23-19, in the first round of the 16-team IHSAA State Finals in 1931 a span of 73 years. That is the sixth longest difference between two visits in tournament history. It was the fourth year the finals were played at Butler Fieldhouse, now known as Hinkle Fieldhouse.

State Finals Appearances: 3 (1929, 1932, 2004)

This is the third appearance in the IHSAA State Finals for Columbia City and the first since 1932 -- a span of 72 seasons. In the Eagles' first trip in 1929, they were the first round victim of eventual state champion Frankfort, 43-18, in what was a 16-team affair at Butler Fieldhouse. In the 1932 finals, again a 16-team duel at Butler, Columbia City again fell in the opening round, this time to Greencastle, 32-19.
