Second Chatard Championship Shutout in Three Years

Bishop Chatard also bettered Andrean, 3-0, in the 2001 3A title contest, the lowest scoring championship game in state finals history.

Still Perfect in Championship Contests

Bishop Chatard has won the state championship in all seven games it has appeared in over the years 1983 (2A), 1984 (2A), 1997 (3A), 1998 (3A), 2001-2003 (3A), including a 2-0 mark over NorthWood in those games. Chatard claimed a 23-6 win over NorthWood in the 1998 3A title game as well.

Three-Peat in Class 3A

The Trojans became the first school in Class 3A and just the third school in state finals football history to claim three consecutive state championships. They join Franklin Central in 2A (1980-82) and Penn in 5A (1995-97) as other teams to win three straight.

Indianapolis Bishop Chatard Coach Vince Lorenzano

Our three state championships in a row are definitely a tribute to a great group of kids we have. These kids are experienced warriors and the bottom line is they get it done. I'm just happy to be on the sidelines guiding such a talented group. The success of this program goes back to the early 1980s. I feel very fortunate and very lucky to be a part of all of this.
