TRI-CENTRAL ROLLS TO SECOND STRAIGHT SMALL SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIP

Tri-Central had to go down to the wire a year ago to win this game and that experience paid off this time as the Trojans successfully defended their Class A state championship at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

The Trojans (21-6) gained the upper-hand mid-way through the first period on an Andrea DeWitt fast-break bucket that put her team up 9-7 and they never trailed again going on to a 46-36 victory over Washington Catholic.

Last year, Tri-Central rallied from a six-point deficit in the final two minutes to defeat defending champ North Vermillion, 57-55. Kathie Layden, in her fifth year, was the coach during both championship seasons.

Three Trojans players scored in double figures for the winners with Meranda Burnett leading the way with 15 points and seven assists. Kristen Miller and Janel Cox added 12 and 10 points, respectively. Miller also pulled down seven boards. Burnett and Miller were the only returning starters from last year stitle squad.

Washington Catholic (22-4), making its first appearance in the girls basketball state finals, was led in scoring by Andrea Hauser s 12 points and six rebounds. Anne Wichman tallied 11 points. As a team, the Cardinals connected on 37.5 percent of their field goals (15-40), but couldn t drop a three pointer, missing all eight attempts.

Tri-Central led by a 22-16 count at halftime but extended that lead to 38-26 at the end of the third period. The Trojans led by as many as 16 points on two occasions in the fourth period at 42-26 and 44-28.

Washington Catholic, the smallest school ever to compete in the girls state finals with 93 students enrolled in four grades, was coached by first year leader Jim Mackey.

Roy Mental Attitude Award. Patricia L. At the conclusion of the girls basketball state finals, the IHSAA Executive Committee presents the award to the outstanding senior in the state finals competition. The recipient of this award, who was nominated by her principal and coach, must excel in mental attitude, scholarship, leadership and athletic ability in girls basketball.

Academically, Kristen ranks No. 14 in her class of 79 and is a member of the National Honor Society. She also is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, French Club, Varsity Choir and is President of the Students Against Destructive Decisions. She has captured the Positive Trojan Award and was a Girls State Representative in 2003. Her college choice is still undecided.

Kristen is also a four-year member of the Trojans volleyball and track & field squads.

She is the daughter of Roger and Panda Miller of Windfall, Indiana.

Tri-Central Coach Kathie Layden

♦ We spent all week preparing for them and trying to shut down (Anne) Wichman. I thought that our defense really won us the game. We did some great things offensively, but it was our defense all season long and it paid off throughout the tournament and today. Those of you who know me know I really don t like to zone. You wouldn t really know it from watching most of that game. I think if you play a really good man-to-man defense it is like playing a matchup zone. I knew they (Washington Catholic) were not a great outside shooting team and that was not one of their strengths. They liked to put the ball on the floor, penetrate and drive to the basket. But the 2-3 zone made it a bit more difficult for them to penetrate.
