# FOURTH QUARTER OFFENSE PROPELS ROCHESTER OVER HERITAGE CHRISTIAN

After a defensive-minded opening three periods, Rochester and Heritage Christian kicked their offenses into high gear in the fourth but it was Rochester that pulled away for the 50-41 victory and the Class 2A state championship at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

The two teams both doubled their scoring outputs in the fourth period from what they had put on the board in the opening three quarters. Rochester scored 25 points to Heritage Christian \$\infty\$ s 21 over the final eight minutes after starting with a 25-20 Zebra lead.

It was the 14<sup>th</sup> consecutive victory for the Zebras (25-2), who were coached by fourth year leader Tony Stesiak, and capped their first state championship season in girls basketball. It was also the fourth title in school history and the first since 1987 when the football team won the Class 2A crown.

Courtney Felke, one of the state s leading scorers at 22.2 per game, scored 15 of Rochester s 25 in the fourth, including 11 at the free throw stripe, to take game honors with 24 points. She finished 13-of-16 from the line for the game, 2A records in both categories as was her .812 percentage from the line. Joining her in double figures was teammate Jamie Fornal with 12 points. The team finished the game 25 of 28 from the line for a .893 percentage, also 2A records in all three categories.

Rochester led at all the breaks, including 13-6 after one and 17-16 at halftime. Heritage Christian (21-6) cut the lead to 25-22 scoring the first bucket of the fourth period but Rochester went on a 10-3 run for a 35-25 advantage with 4:19 to go. The Zebras ballooned the lead to 11 points twice in the quarter and the Eagles never got closer than seven the rest of the game. Cassie Freeman, also one of the state seleading scorers at 20.0 per game, and Hannah Richards chalked up 14 and 13 points, respectively for Heritage Christian.

Heritage Christian, which became an IHSAA member school in 2000-01, was making its first trip to the IHSAA State Finals in Girls Basketball in only its second year of eligibility for the tournament. The Eagles were coached by Dr. Mark Richards and entered the game with 11 consecutive victories.

Rochester S Courtney Felke Wins Patricia L. Roy Mental Attitude Award Courtney Felke of Rochester Community High School was named winner of the 2004 Class 2A Girls Basketball Patricia L. Roy Mental Attitude Award. Patricia L. Roy was a member of the IHSAA Executive Staff from 1972 until 1999. She was responsible for girls basketball from the inception of the tournament series in 1976 until her

retirement.

At the conclusion of the girls basketball state finals, the IHSAA Executive Committee presents the award to the outstanding senior in the state finals competition. The recipient of this award, who was nominated by her principal and coaches, must excel in mental attitude, scholarship, leadership and athletic ability in girls basketball.

Academically, Courtney ranks 25<sup>th</sup> in her senior class of 118. She is a member of the National Honor Society. After inquiries from over sixty colleges and universities, she will attend the University of Evansville on a full-ride basketball scholarship.

She is a member of Peers Educating Peers, Student Council, Fellowship of Christian Athletes and 6 Man Club.

In basketball, Courtney was named to the 2003-04 All-Three Rivers Conference 1<sup>st</sup> Team. In volleyball, she garnered 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-State team accolades two years, as well as earning 1<sup>st</sup> team Three Rivers Conference honors for three seasons.

Courtney is the daughter of Katie and Jim Felke of Rochester.
