JACKSON LEADS BREBEUF JESUIT TO 3A STATE TITLE

Senior forward Amber Jackson scored 22 points to lead top-ranked Brebeuf Jesuit to a 54-38 victory over Fort Wayne Bishop Luers in the Class 3A state championship game at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

Jackson, who averaged 13.5 points per game entering the contest, hit 9-of-12 shots from the field, was 4-for-5 from the free throw line and collected seven rebounds to help the Braves capture their first state championship in girls basketball. The victory came 22 years after the school so only other previous appearance in 1982.

The game was also a rematch of the January 24 regular season contest in which Brebeuf Jesuit won at Bishop Luers, 56-40.

Jackson was joined in double figures by teammate Natalie Mullikin who finished with 10 points. The Braves, coached by second year mentor Kendall Kreinhagen, finished their championship season at 26-3. Brebeuf led at all the stops • 11-8 at the end of one, 20-14 at halftime and 32-26 at the end of the third period.

The fourth-ranked Knights were led by Jessica Hathaway and Marie Kaufmann with 13 points a piece. Kaufmann also pulled down six boards for the Luers cause.

Bishop Luers (22-4), making its record fifth appearance in the state finals in the last six seasons, fell for the first time in five state championship contests. The Knights won 2A titles in 1999, 2000 and 2001 and the 3A championship in 2002. Luers was coached by Teri Rosinski, now in her third year.

Brebeuf Jesuit s Amber Jackson Named Patricia L. Roy Mental Attitude Award Recipient

Amber Jackson of Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School was named winner of the 2004 Class 3A Girls Basketball Patricia L. Roy Mental Attitude Award. Patricia L. Roy was a member of the IHSAA Executive Staff from 1972 until 1999. She was responsible for girls basketball from the inception of the tournament series in 1976 until her retirement.

At the conclusion of the girls basketball state finals, the IHSAA Executive Committee presents the award to the outstanding senior in the state finals competition. The recipient of this award, who was nominated by her principal and coaches, must excel in mental attitude, scholarship, leadership and athletic ability in girls basketball.

Academically, Amber is in the top 25% of her class and has been on the High Honor Roll every semester at the college prep school. She is a member of the Black Student Union, where she held the office of Vice-President the last two years, and is also a founding member of the Diversity Advocates. She was the recipient of the 2003 Scientific American Outstanding Achievement Award and will attend the

University of North Texas on a basketball scholarship. She plans to study Education and wants to become a high school teacher and basketball coach.

She also volunteers her time with Help for the Holidays and the Lord s Pantry, collecting food for homeless shelters.

Athletically, in addition to capturing four varsity letters in basketball, she was also a participant in volleyball and track & field earlier in her career with the Braves. She is a Street & Smith Magazine Honorable Mention All-American for 2003-04.

Amber is the daughter of Ms. Cynthia Jackson and Mr. Vincent Jackson of Indianapolis.
