FOR ACTION

1) MINUTES

The minutes of the April 29, 2019 meeting were recommended for approval.

A motion for approval was made by Tim Grove; seconded by Jim Brown; motion approved 19-0.

2) EMERGENCY BY-LAW ADOPTIONS

Commissioner Bobby Cox and Attorney Bob Baker spoke to the following potential by-law adoptions for consideration:

a) Proposed amendment to section 7-1.4 Coaching Accreditation, will establish a coaching Accreditation rule to meet the requirements of HR 1209.

7-1.4 Mandatory Coaching Accreditation

a. Accreditation. A paid or volunteer coach of an IHSAA recognized sport must currently be Accredited. To attain Accreditation Beginning the 2018-19 school year, all coaches:

(1) must not have been convicted of an offense described in Ind. Code § 20-28-5-8, or have been convicted of a known comparable offense in another state, and must not be under a teacher's license suspension because of misconduct described in Ind. Code §§ 20-28-5-7(1), (2), and,

(2) must have completed the following specific education courses ~~to be an accredited IHSAA coach:~~

(a.) ~~a.~~ NFHS Concussion in Sports,

(b.) ~~b.~~ NFHS Heat Illness Prevention, and

(c.) ~~c.~~ NFHS Sudden Cardiac Arrest.

These courses must be repeated every Two (2) years or when the edition of the course changes, whichever comes first.

b. ~~Suspension and Revocation of Accreditation.~~

(1) Accreditation of a coach may be revoked by the Commissioner if the IHSAA receives notice that the coach has been convicted of an offense described in Ind. Code § 20-28-5-8, or has been convicted of a known comparable offense in another state; provided, however, that after holding a hearing on the matter, the IHSAA may reinstate the Accreditation if the conviction is later reversed, vacated, or set aside on appeal.

(2) Accreditation of a coach who is a licensed teacher may be suspended or revoked by the Commissioner if it is reported to the IHSAA by the Department of Education that the coach committed misconduct described in Ind. Code §§ 20-28-5-7(1), 20-28-5-7), (2) and such misconduct led to the teacher's license revocation or suspension.

(3) Accreditation of a coach may be suspended or revoked if the Commissioner finds that the coach's conduct is an anathema to the rules, regulations, purposes or goals of the IHSAA.

A motion for approval was made by John Steinhilber; seconded by Matt Martin; motion approved 19-0.

b) Proposed amendment to section 17-4.2, will incorporate an alternate Review Committee when the subject of a Review Committee hearing implicates a school or individual having a connection with a current member of the Executive Committee.

17-4.2 Review Committee and Hearing Officer

The Review Committee shall be comprised of:

- a. At least Three (3) members of the Executive Committee who shall be appointed by the Chairman, or his designee. Membership on a panel of the Review Committee shall be for One (1) or more hearing sessions.
- b. The Chairman of the Executive Committee, or his designee, shall assume the duties of hearing officer of the Review Committee.
- c. [In the event a matter to be heard by the Review Committee directly involves a school or individual having a direct connection with a member of the Board of Directors, the Chairman shall appoint a new three-member Committee and a new hearing officer to hear the case. These new members and the new hearing officer may not be an IHSAA staff member, a member of the Board of Directors or an individual having a direct connection with a school or individual directly involved with a matter to be heard by this new Review Committee.](#)

A motion for approval was made by Chris Conley; seconded by Ed Gilliland; motion approved 19-0.

c) Proposed amendment to IHSAA Rule 54-3.1, to clarify that no football player can play in more than 4 quarters of sub-varsity during a week period.

54-3.1

Interschool football participation by a player shall be limited to a maximum of:

- a. Thirty-Six (36) Varsity season quarters, limited to Four (4) Varsity quarters per week; or
- b. Fifty-Four (54) season quarters limited to Six (6) quarters during a week with no more than Two (2) Varsity quarters included. [No player may participate in more than Four \(4\) sub-Varsity quarters per week.](#) It shall not count as a Varsity quarter if a player participates only in a kicking down. A kicking down is defined as a kickoff, kick-off return, punt, punt return, field goal and kicked extra point.

A motion for approval was made by Martin Brown; seconded by Jim Brown; motion approved 19-0.

22) LITIGATION REPORT

Attorney Robert Baker updated the Executive Committee on the current status of pending litigation against the Association.

23) PENALTIES ASSESSED

Argos HS – Rule 19-3 (*Softball player participated in multiple contests without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Argos High School softball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The contests where the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Argos High School was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Bethesda Christian HS – Rule 7-1.4 (*Multiple members of coaching staff have not completed mandatory coach education requirements*)

Brown County HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' track and field athlete participated in multiple meets without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Brown County girls' track and field program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.

3. The track and field meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Brownsburg HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' track and field athlete participated in multiple meets without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Brownsburg girls' track and field program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The track and field meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Carroll (Flora) HS – Rule 3-10 (*Boys' golfer participated in multiple meets without an approved physical and consent form on file*)

1. The Carroll (Flora) High School boys' golf program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Head Coach Larry Kingery and Athletic Director Luke Harlow are reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. This is a health and safety issue and it is absolutely imperative that the "IHSA Pre-Participation Evaluation Form" complete in every detail be on file for all student athletes prior to their participation in a practice, let alone an interscholastic contest.
3. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student provides a valid pre-participation physical and consent form to the school.
4. Any scores submitted on behalf of the student athlete shall be removed and the team scores refigured. All opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Culver Academies – Rule 15-2.5 (*Boys' basketball program conducted an open workout outside the prescribed period for limited contact which also included alumni participation*)

1. Culver Academies has accepted an invitation to come speak to the Board.

Eastern (Greentown) HS – Rule 18-1 (*Boys track and field athlete participated in multiple contests while academically ineligible*)

1. The Eastern (Greentown) High School boys' track and field program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be declared ineligible immediately. The student may gain academic eligibility at the next certification date of the school.
3. Any points earned by the ineligible athlete shall be removed and the team scores refigured. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Eminence HS – Rule 4-1 (*Baseball player has participated in multiple contests and will turn 20 years of age before the state baseball finals*)

1. The Eminence High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible for further competition.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, the contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Eminence was victorious. The participating schools involved with this violation shall be notified.

Fort Wayne Concordia Lutheran HS – Rule 18-1 (*Boys' track and field athlete participated in multiple meets while academically ineligible*)

1. The Fort Wayne Concordia Lutheran High School boys' track and field program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be declared ineligible immediately. The student may gain academic eligibility at the next certification date of the school.
3. Any points earned by the ineligible athlete shall be removed and the team scores refigured. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Hamilton Southeastern HS - Rule 3-9.4 (*Baseball player participated in sectional contest while not appearing on the sectional entry list*)

1. The Hamilton Southeastern High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Athletic Director Greg Habegger and Head Coach Jeremy Sassanella are reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. It is imperative that the sectional entry list reflect all student athletes that may participate in a tournament series event in a given sport.
3. Rule 16-3 of the IHSAA by-laws allows for a waiver of the provisions of Rule 3-9 when an administrative error causes the ineligibility of a student. It is clear in this case; an administrative error has been made.
4. Hamilton Southeastern High School shall remit a penalty of \$200.00 to the IHSAA immediately in lieu of the disqualification of Jordan Millikan.

Indianapolis Manual HS – F-10 Policy Violation (*Softball team forfeited their tournament series contest after the drawing was completed - PROBATION*)

1. The Indianapolis Emmerich Manual High School softball program is placed on probation for the 2019-20 season. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated.
2. As per IHSAA policy, Indianapolis Emmerich Manual High School shall remit \$400.00 as a financial penalty in this matter.

Morristown HS – Rule 19-3 (*Baseball player participated in multiple games without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Morristown High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The contests where the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Morristown High School was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Muncie Central HS – Rule 9-6a and Rule 18-1 (*Ineligible baseball player participated in a junior varsity contest; student from a non-member school participated on the junior varsity team of the school as well as an assistant coach*)

1. The Muncie Central baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that illegal acts have occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The academically ineligible student is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contest in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Muncie Central was victorious. The opposing school shall be made aware of this violation.
4. Head Coach Norm West is reprimanded for allowing these violations to occur. A clear understanding of the by-laws of the Association shall be maintained by every coach and communicated thoroughly prior to the season.
5. Assistant Coach Garrison Rehfus is reprimanded for his participation in the contest. It should be undoubtedly obvious that an adult coach should not be participating as a player in a high school contest.

New Washington HS – Rule 19-3 (*Baseball player participated in multiple games without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The New Washington High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The contests where the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if New Washington High School was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

North Central (Farmersburg) HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' track and field athlete participated in multiple meets without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The North Central girls' track and field program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.

2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The track and field meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

North Knox HS – Rule 15-1.2a (*Softball player participated in a non-school sponsored contest during the authorized contest season*)

1. The North Knox High School softball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended for the next North Knox softball game on the school schedule.

North Newton HS - Rule 3-9.4 (*Multiple baseball players participated in multiple sectional contests while not appearing on the sectional entry list*)

1. The North Newton High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Athletic Director Robert Johnson and Head Coach Derek Merriman are reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. It is imperative that the sectional entry list reflect all student athletes that may participate in a tournament series event in a given sport. It is incomprehensible that up to seven individuals from a school's baseball team could be inadvertently left off a sectional entry list.
3. Rule 16-3 of the IHSAA by-laws allows for a waiver of the provisions of Rule 3-9 when an administrative error causes the ineligibility of a student. It is clear in this case; an administrative error has been made.
4. North Newton High School shall remit a penalty of \$200.00 to the IHSAA immediately in lieu of the disqualification of Joshua Bailey, Cade Ehlinger, Dekin Ward and Bryce Rainford

Northridge HS – Rule 51-4 (*Baseball pitcher exceeded the allowable number of pitches in a contest*)

1. The Northridge High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Head Coach Andrew Brabender is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. The provisions of Rule 51-4 have been written to promote the health and safety of student athletes in the sport of baseball along with creating a level field of competition between schools. Subsequently, Coach Brabender is suspended from the IHSAA Baseball Regional contest vs. Mishawaka High School on Saturday, June 1, 2019. Coach Brabender may not attend the contest and may rejoin the team upon conclusion of said contest.
3. As per Rule 3-9.4a1 of the IHSAA by-laws, student athlete Davis Enfield is disqualified from the IHSAA Baseball Regional contest vs. Mishawaka on Saturday, June 1, 2019. Should Northridge High School advance to the regional finals or beyond, Mr. Enfield may participate in those contests.

Penn HS – Rule 9-13 (*Boys' golf coach invited a team member to join him for a round of golf on Sunday*)

1. The Penn High School boys' golf program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Assistant Coach Troy Hahaj is reprimanded for allowing these violations to occur. Ignorance of the rules is not an acceptable rationale for violating IHSAA by-laws.

Perry Meridian HS – Rule 51-3.d (*Two Baseball players played in JV and Varsity games that were being played simultaneously*)

1. The Perry Meridian High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Head Coach Jake Banwart is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. Ignorance of the rules is not an acceptable excuse for a rules violation.
3. Both the junior varsity and varsity contests shall be forfeited if Perry Meridian was victorious. The opposing school(s) shall be made aware of this violation.

Pike HS – Rule 18-1 (*Multiple girls' track and field athletes participated in multiple meets while academically ineligible*)

1. The Pike High School girls' track and field program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athletes involved in this violation shall be declared ineligible immediately. The students may gain academic eligibility at the next certification date of the school.
3. Any points earned by the ineligible athletes shall be removed and the team scores refigured. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Plymouth HS – Rule 15-2.2 (*Eight boys' soccer players were rostered together on a non-school sponsored team*)

1. The Plymouth High School boys' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The students involved in this violation shall all be suspended one (1) game on the 2019-20 Plymouth High School boys' soccer schedule. These suspensions may be spread out over the first four contests on the schedule.

Silver Creek HS – Rule 3-9.4 (*Baseball player participated in sectional contest while not appearing on the sectional entry list*)

1. The Silver Creek High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Athletic Director Jeff Harrell and Head Coach Joe Decker are reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. It is imperative that the sectional entry list reflect all student athletes that may participate in a tournament series event in a given sport.
3. Rule 16-3 of the IHSAA by-laws allows for a waiver of the provisions of Rule 3-9 when an administrative error causes the ineligibility of a student. It is clear in this case; an administrative error has been made.
4. Silver Creek High School shall remit a penalty of \$200.00 to the IHSAA immediately in lieu of the disqualification of Josh Landers.

Sullivan HS – Rule 15-1.2a (*Two softball players participated in a non-school softball game*)

1. The Sullivan High School softball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athletes involved in this violation are hereby suspended for the remainder of the IHSAA tournament series in softball. The team continues to advance in the tournament series.

West Lafayette HS – Rule 18-1 (*Baseball player participated in multiple contests while academically ineligible*)

1. The West Lafayette High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which this ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if West Lafayette was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

West Vigo HS – Rules 9-13 (*Baseball coach attended workouts being conducted in a non-school owned facility on Sunday*)

1. The West Vigo High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Head Coach Culley DeGroote is reprimanded for allowing these violations to occur. Ignorance of the rules is not an acceptable rationale for violating IHSAA by-laws.
3. It is also noted by the IHSAA that potential players for the West Vigo baseball program were notified in December of 2018 they were not going to be selected by the coaching staff for the program. While there is no evidence that these players were dismissed due to their performances in limited contact opportunities, it is not defensible to eliminate players prior to official practices for the season being held and evaluated.
