REPORTS

3) REPORT FROM STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

IHSAA Student Advisory Committee President Tom Newton of Harrison (West Lafayette) and Vice-President Lydia Laker of Franklin Central reported on the group's summer retreat at Bradford Woods in Martinsville. They also discussed the student meetings conducted during the Fall Area Principals Meetings, shared a video from last summer's Student Leadership Conference, the Champions Together program, plans for the upcoming state championship events, and their goals for the 2019-20 school year.

4) REPORT ON CHAIR OFFICIALS FOR THE BOYS TENNIS TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Chris Kaufman presented a list of USTA chair officials eligible for use in the tennis state tournament series.

5) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE CROSS COUNTRY TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Paul Neidig presented a list of cross country starters eligible for the state tournament series. It was noted that eight new officials have applied for and received one of the 32 assignments for this year's tournaments.

6) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE SOCCER TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Sandra Walter presented a list of 327 soccer officials who applied for the state tournament series and 288 were assigned as sectionals began earlier this week.

7) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Kerrie Schludecker submitted a list of 185 volleyball officials who have applied to work the state tournament series with 128 of those assigned to work during sectionals which begin next week.

8) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Robert Faulkens presented a list of officials who make up 148 football crews who applied to work the state tournament series. Faulkens will begin assigning crews to sectional games next week following this Sunday's pairings show.

9) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE UNIFIED FLAG FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Robert Faulkens reported that 53 applicants are being used for the Second Annual Unified Flag Football State Tournament which plays regional games this Saturday.

11) REPORT ON NFHS SECTION 4 MEETING

Commissioner Bobby Cox reported on the 2019 NFHS Section 4 meeting hosted by the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association in Stevens Point, WI on September 19-20, 2019. Executive Directors and Commissioners from the Section 4 states of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan and Wisconsin - along with the President of the NFHS, Executive Director and other invited guests participated in discussions surrounding education-based athletics and activities.

He reported that some technology changes will be coming to the NFHS in the coming year and they are looking at Indiana's officials platform along with some other states to garner ideas to use at the national level and to assist other states with fewer resources.

Some of the topics discussed included the NCAA June scholastic events and how they went at the state and/or regional level, transfer and participation rules by state and the rationale behind them, and the substantiation of bullying as a reason behind some transfers. A pair of doctors from the University of Wisconsin spoke to issues related to sports medicine and mental health with high school students and how it affects athletics.

12) REPORT ON MIDWEST OFFICIALS SUMMIT

Assistant Commissioner Sandra Walter reported on topics from the 2019 Midwest Officials' Summit on September 22-24, 2019 in Louisville, KY.

The group of association administrators from surrounding states discussed electronic rule books, background checks, recruitment, training, and technology in tracking attendance at meetings. The latter of which several states have not attempted to do yet.

13) REPORT ON HEAD STRONG CONCUSSION INSURANCE CLAIMS

Assistant Commissioner Paul Neidig reported that 62 schools participated last year, the program's first year, and that 19,946 student athletes were covered. There were 23 claims that were paid on last year. He noted that a slight drop has occurred during this year's enrollment period with only 54 schools and 15,848 student athletes purchasing the coverage.

Angola HS – Rule 19-3 (*Boys' soccer player participated in multiple soccer matches without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Angola High School boys' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The contests where the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Angola High School was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Beech Grove HS – Rule 19-3 (*Multiple football players participated in multiple contests without approved transfer reports on file*)

1. The Beech Grove High School football program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The students are declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The contests where the ineligible athletes participated in shall be forfeited if Beech Grove High School was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Carmel HS – Rule 15-1.3 (*Girls' soccer player participated in a non-school camp during the authorized contest season*)

1. The Carmel High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student involved in this violation shall be suspended from the Carmel vs. Zionsville sectional contest on October 10, 2019. Should Carmel advance beyond this contest, the student may participate in subsequent contests in the tournament series.

Chesterton HS – Rule 54-3.1b (*Two freshmen football players exceed the allowable quarters to play during a football week*)

1. The Chesterton High School football program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The IHSAA accepts and supports the suspensions of Coaches Kenny Floyd and Adam Tenbarga for these violations.

3. The contest in which this violation occurred shall be forfeited if Chesterton was victorious. The opposing school shall be notified of these violations.
4. All quarters played by the students listed above shall count toward the maximum number of quarters in a season.

Christel House Academy – Rule 12-2 (*Three boys' soccer players participated beyond their eighth semester of high school*)

1. The Christel House boys' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athletes involved in this violation are declared ineligible immediately.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athletes participated shall be forfeited if Christel House was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Concord HS – Rule 15-1.2a (*Two boys' soccer players knowingly participated in a non-school sponsored soccer game during the authorized contest season*)

1. The Concord High School boys' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athletes involved in this violation are hereby suspended for the next four (4) contests on the Concord High School boys' soccer schedule.

Fort Wayne Concordia Lutheran HS – Rule 106-3b (*Girls' soccer player participated in four halves in a single session*)

1. The Fort Wayne Concordia High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Coach Jenni Cunningham is reprimanded for this violation. A limitation of halves for players is necessary for the health and safety of the participant.
3. The contest in which this violation occurred shall be forfeited if Fort Wayne Concordia Lutheran was victorious. The opposing school shall be notified of this violation.
4. All halves played by Mahlet Lee shall count toward the maximum number of player halves in a season.

Franklin Central HS – Rule 111-4 (*Volleyball player participated in too many sets during a single session*)

1. The Franklin Central High School volleyball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Coach Davin Testerman is reprimanded for permitting this violation to occur. A lack of attentiveness to the rules is not an acceptable explanation for a rules violation.
3. In accordance with rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, the opposing school must be notified that this violation occurred and the match in which the violation occurred shall be forfeited if Franklin Central was victorious.
4. Participation in these matches shall all count toward the total of allowable matches the student in violation may participate in.

Frontier HS – Rule 19-3 (*Boys' cross country runner participated in multiple meets without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Frontier High School boys' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The cross country meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Goshen HS – Rule 15-1.2a (*Two boys' soccer players participated in a non-school sponsored soccer game during the authorized contest season*)

1. The Goshen High School boys' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athletes involved in this violation are hereby suspended for one contest on the Goshen High School boys' soccer schedule.

Greencastle HS – Rule 18-1 (*Football player participated in multiple games while academically ineligible*)

1. The Greencastle High School football program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which this ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Greencastle was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Homestead HS – Rule 15-1.3 (*Girls' soccer player participated in a non-school camp during the authorized contest season*)

1. The Homestead High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student involved in this violation shall be suspended from the Homestead vs. Huntington North sectional contest on October 10, 2019. Should Homestead advance beyond this contest, the student may participate in subsequent contests in the tournament series.

Indian Creek HS – Rule 18-1 (*Volleyball player participated in two matches while academically ineligible*)

1. The Indian Creek High School volleyball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which this ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Indian Creek was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Lake Station HS – Rule 15-2.2c (*Girls' basketball coach instructed freshman in a non-school sponsored scrimmage*)

1. The Lake Station Edison High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Coach Rudy Chabes is reprimanded for this violation. Ignorance of the rules is not an acceptable excuse for a rules violation.

LaVille HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' cross country runner participated in multiple meets without an approved foreign exchange student eligibility report on file*)

1. The LaVille girls' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The cross country meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Linton-Stockton HS – Rule 19-3 (*Boys' cross country runner participated in multiple meets without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Linton-Stockton High School boys' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The cross country meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Madison-Grant HS – Rule 19-3 (*Baseball player participated in multiple contests without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Madison-Grant High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The contests where the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Madison-Grant High School was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Marion HS – Rule 50-1 (*Football player participated in a junior varsity contest without the requisite ten separate days of practice under the direct supervision of the coaching staff*)

1. The Marion High School football program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Coach Craig Chambers is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. Lack of attention to details regarding the execution of IHSAA by-laws is an unacceptable excuse for a rules violation.
3. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible for further competition until he meets the minimum standards for eligibility. Additionally, the contest in which the student participated does not count toward the requisite of ten separate days of practice under the direct supervision of the football coaching staff.
4. In accordance with Rule 3-9, the contest in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Marion was victorious and the opposing school shall be notified of this violation.

Marquette Catholic HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' soccer player participated in a contest without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Marquette Catholic High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The contest where the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Marquette Catholic High School was victorious. The opposing school shall be notified of this violation.

Milan HS – Rule 15-1.3 (*Girls' soccer player participated in a non-school camp during the authorized contest season*)

1. The Milan High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student involved in this violation shall be suspended from the Milan vs. Oldenburg Academy sectional contest on October 10, 2019. Should Milan advance beyond this contest, the student may participate in subsequent contests in the tournament series.

Mt. Vernon (Posey) HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' golfer participated in multiple matches without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Mt. Vernon girls' golf program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The golf matches the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Muncie Burriss HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' cross country runner participated in a meet without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Muncie Burriss High School girls' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The cross country meet the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

North Central (Farmersburg) HS – Rule 18-1 (*Girls' cross country runner participated in multiple meets while academically ineligible*)

1. The North Central High School girls' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be declared ineligible immediately. The student may gain academic eligibility at the next certification date of the school.

3. Any points earned by the ineligible athlete shall be removed and the team scores refigured. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Northeast Dubois HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' cross country runner participated in multiple meets without an approved foreign exchange student eligibility report on file*)

1. The Northeast Dubois High School girls' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed foreign exchange student eligibility report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The cross country meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Norwell HS – Rule 19-3 (*Boys' soccer player participated in a contest without a completed foreign exchange student eligibility form on file*)

1. The Norwell High School boys' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The contest where the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Norwell High School was victorious. The opposing school shall be notified of this violation.

Seymour HS – Rule 15-1.1a (*Boys' cross country runner participated in a non-school sponsored event during the authorized contest season without an approved waiver*)

1. The Seymour High School boys' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation is suspended for the next interscholastic contest on the Seymour High School boys' cross country schedule.

Shenandoah HS – Rule 9-6a (*Junior high boys' tennis players participated in exhibition matches against high school students from member schools*)

1. The Shenandoah boys' tennis program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that illegal acts have occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Coach John Rhoads is reprimanded for this violation. Ignorance of the rules is not an acceptable excuse for a rules violation.
3. The IHSAA accepts and supports the suspension of Coach Rhoads for two matches on the Shenandoah High School schedule.

Shoals HS – Rule 9-16.1 (*Boys' soccer coach removed his team from the pitch after being ejected from the contest – PROBATION*)

1. The Shoals High School boys' soccer program is placed on probation for the remainder of the 2019-20 season. Probation is a severe type of warning that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated. Similar and further acts which violate IHSAA by-laws and/or policies of the Association by the boys' soccer program shall be dealt with in a more severe manner.
2. Coach Kevin Hert is suspended from the IHSAA Boys' Soccer sectional tournament. Coach Hert shall not be on the premises of the tournament nor maintain contact with the squad at the venue. Should Shoals High School advance to the regional, Coach Hert may rejoin the team in his coaching capacity.
3. It is strongly encouraged that the Shoals High School administration conduct a thorough conversation with Coach Hert regarding his obligations during an interscholastic contest including proper sportsmanship and the proper conclusion of interschool events.

South Bend Riley HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' golfer participated in multiple matches without an approved foreign exchange student eligibility request on file*)

1. The South Bend Riley girls' golf program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The golf matches the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

South Spencer HS – Rule 50-1 (*Boys' cross country runner did not complete the requisite ten separate days of practice before interscholastic competition*)

1. The South Spencer High School boys' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that an illegal act has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. Head Coach Dakota Risse is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. Lack of attention to detail is an unacceptable excuse for a rules violation.
3. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible for further competition until he meets the minimum standards for eligibility. Additionally, the contest in which the student participated does not count toward the requisite of ten separate days of practice under the direct supervision of the cross country coaching staff.
4. In accordance with Rule 3-9, the contest in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete and the opposing school(s) shall be notified of this violation.

Springs Valley HS – Rule 19-3 (*Girls' cross country runner participated in multiple meets without an approved foreign exchange student eligibility report on file*)

1. The Springs Valley girls' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The cross country meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

1. The Trinity Lutheran High School girls' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The cross country meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Wawasee HS – Rule 19-3 (*Boys' soccer player participated in multiple contests without an approved foreign exchange student eligibility report on file*)

1. The Wawasee High School boys' soccer program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed foreign exchange student eligibility report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The contests where the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Wawasee High School was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Wheeler HS – Rule 18-1 (*Boys' soccer player participated in multiple matches while academically ineligible*)

1. The Trinity Lutheran High School girls' cross country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The cross country meets the ineligible student participated in shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.
