**MEDIA HOSTS:** IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille, Communications Director Chris Kaufman and assistant Toni Polizzi will be on hand to assist in your coverage of this year's state finals.

**CREDENTIALS:** The deadline for requests is **Thursday, March 24, 4 pm ET / 3 pm CT.**

Credentials will not be granted after that time. For media outlets intending to cover the boys basketball state finals, please apply for credentials by e-mailing your request (with name of individual applying) to IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille ([jwille@ihsaa.org](mailto:jwille@ihsaa.org)). E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, aol.com, gmail.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Approved requests will be available for pickup inside the media entrance on game day. Credentials will not be mailed.

**MEDIA PARKING:** There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are numerous parking options within a short distance of Conesco Fieldhouse, including the Virginia Street parking garage directly to the east of the venue which charges a fee.

**MEDIA WILL-CALL/ENTRANCE:** To gain admittance, the 2010-11 IHSAA Boys Basketball State Finals Media Credential is required. The entrance is on the southeast side of Conesco Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Credentials may be claimed beginning at 8 am ET for the first session and at 4 pm ET for the second session. Please have identification available and be prepared to have bags and equipment checked by security officials.

**MEDIA WORKROOM:** As in previous years, the media workroom at Conesco Fieldhouse will be open all day and be available to working media members. The work area contains wireless internet access as well as complimentary phones that will accept credit card and 800 calls. Soft drinks and snacks will be available.

**SEAT ASSIGNMENTS:** Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used along press row.

**RESULTS & STATISTICS:** Live stats for each game will be available on the IHSAA website. Stats and box scores will be distributed at the end of each quarter on press row as well as in the media work room.

**LOCKER ROOM ACCESS:** No one except tournament workers and team members will have access to the inner hallways where locker rooms are located.

**NO CHILDREN, PLEASE:** With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

**LIVE TELEVISION CUT-INS:** Spot news reports showing live game action is prohibited. Stand-up reports for newscasts are permitted from inside the building provided that no live action is shown.

### POST-GAME GUIDELINES

With the exception of the IHSAA's Radio, Television, Internet and Photography partners, all media members are asked to remain off the playing floor and behind the ropes during the post-game awards ceremonies.

The post-game ceremonies order will be as follows:

- Mental Attitude Award presentation
- Runner-Up medals and trophy presentation
- Championship medals and trophy presentation
- Team Photographs by Visual Sports Network

**Following the Class A, 2A and 3A awards ceremonies,** coaches and selected players will be escorted to the Media Interview Room for a formal press conference which is located on playing floor level just off the media entrance elevator. We ask your assistance to use the press conference as the appropriate time to conduct interviews. The runner-up team coach and selected players will go first followed by the championship team coach and players.

**Because of newspaper deadline issues at the end of the 4A contest,** no press conference will be scheduled and news media will be allowed to conduct interviews on and around the floor after the awards ceremonies. For those working on deadline, the IHSAA will distribute "quick quotes" in the media work room taken from the IHSAA Television and Radio Network interviews as soon as possible after the game.

### Triton Notes

- Ranked No. 2 in Class A by Associated Press.
- Triton to make its third appearance in four seasons in the Class A state championship game. Team defeated Indianapolis Lutheran, 50-42, in 2008 and lost to Jac-Cen-Del, 66-55, in 2009.
- Sophomore Clay Yeo, who finished with 10 points and five rebounds, hit two free throws with 32.8 seconds left in overtime to help Triton post a 44-42 victory over Rockville in the Lafayette Jefferson semi-state. Griffyn Carpenter led all scorers with 23 points.
- Since starting the season 5-3, Triton has reeled off 17 straight victories, including its 55-47 win over No. 8 Morgan Township in the regional championship game.
- Trojans rank fifth in the state in points allowed (42.0 ppg) and 13th in margin of victory (15.2 ppg).
- Head coach Jason Groves is 119-29 in six years at the school.

### Indianapolis Metropolitan Notes

- Not ranked in final Associated Press poll.
- School making its first appearance in the IHSAA State Finals in any sport in just its third year of state tournament eligibility. The Pumas will play their third consecutive top 10 opponent in No. 2 Triton on Saturday.
- Senior-dominated team with seven of eight rostered players in their final year of high school.
- Pumas won the school's first sectional championship in any sport with its 75-44 victory over Fall Creek Academy on March 5.
- Metropolitan captured its first regional championship on successive three point victories over Southwestern (Shelbyville) (47-44) and No. 9 Shawe Memorial (64-61) on March 12. The latter game was capped by an improbable three-pointer by Jerrbryon Graves from the opposite free throw line as time expired and came just moments after Shawe had tied the game. Graves took the inbounds pass, drove to the middle of the floor and heaved the ball baseball-throw-style with a defender right in front of him. The play may be found on YouTube and was featured as the No. 1 Top Play on ESPN's SportsCenter.
- Team's defense and late free throws (12-for-12 from the free throw line for the game) helped Pumas to a 61-50 semi-state victory, its first, over No. 5 North Daviess in the Southport Semi-State championship game. North Daviess had cut the lead to 49-45 with 1:23 left in the game.
- Head coach Nick Reich is 48-41 in his fourth year at the school.
- Indianapolis Metropolitan is a public charter school located on Indianapolis' near west side. The school was approved for IHSAA membership in 2006-07 and fielded its first basketball team in 2007-08 (Fort Wayne Northrop won the 1973-74 state championship in just its third year of existence while Bowman Academy won last year's Class A championship in its second year of state tournament eligibility).

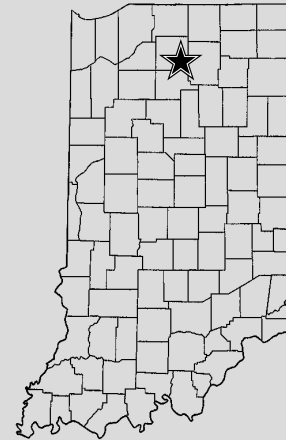

- Senior Cody Zeller, one the of the nation's top seniors, is the team standout averaging 24.1 ppg and 13.3 rpg. Older brothers, Luke (2005) and Tyler (2008), currently playing for North Carolina, were both named Indiana Mr. Basketball. All three have led Washington to a state championship.
- Zeller, playing for his third state championship, finished the semi-state game with 23 points, 17 rebounds and six blocks in a game that was tied 27-27 at the half as Washington went on to win 66-48.
- Head coach Gene Miiller is one of just seven active coaches in the state with 500 or more career victories. He is 128-22 in six years at Washington and 596-250 in 36 years of coaching. He has coached the Hatchets to their last two state titles and would become the ninth coach in state history with three or more state championships with a victory on Saturday.

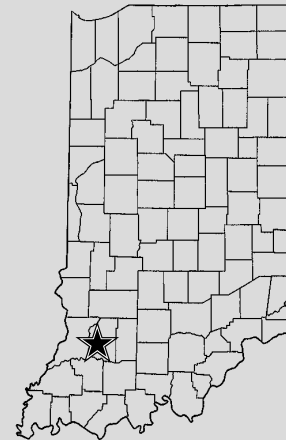

- Ranked No. 10 in the Associated Press Class 4A poll; No. 9 by the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association.
- Kokomo playing for school's second boys basketball state championship 50 years after its 1961 state title. Kokomo defeated Indianapolis Manual in overtime, 68-66, that year overcoming a seven-point deficit in the final minute of regulation time.
- Wildkats playing in state finals for first time since 1997 when it lost to Bloomington North in the semifinals and appearing in their first state championship game since 1989 runner-up team.
- Team toppled No. 1 and previously undefeated Munster, 47-44, in Saturday's semi-state at Lafayette Jefferson. D.J. Balentine hit the game-winning three-pointer from the top of the key in the closing seconds to give Kokomo its eighth semi-state championship in school history.
- One week earlier, LaBradford Sebree hit a buzzer-beating three-pointer in the second overtime of a thrilling 58-55 win over Pendleton Heights for the regional championship.
- Won state-leading 71st sectional championship with its 92-57 win over Logansport on March 5 (Lafayette Jefferson and Vincennes Lincoln are second with 68 each).
- School has four basketball state championships including the girls team which won titles in 1992, 1993 and 2003 (4A).
- Head coach Brian McCauley is 72-41 in his fifth year at the school.

#### Bloomington South Notes

- Ranked No. 4 in the Associated Press Class 4A poll; No. 3 by the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association.
- Bloomington South has won 11 straight games and will be seeking its second 4A state crown in three seasons and third title overall (1919) when it faces No. 10 Kokomo on Saturday.
- In a meeting of the last two 4A state championship teams, the Panthers toppled No. 2 North Central, 76-66, in the Southport Semi-State game on Saturday winning its third semi-state crown in school history. In that game, South's lethal 1-2 scoring punch of Dee Davis and Spencer Turner, scored 31 and 24 points, respectively.
- Panthers rank 11th in state in scoring (69.5 ppg) and 23rd in margin of victory (13.3 ppg).
- Only previous meeting between the two school's occurred in the 1919 state quarterfinals when Bloomington captured a 23-14 victory on its way to the state championship. That year, 22 teams squared off in the state finals which were played over three days at Purdue University's Memorial Gymnasium.
- Head coach J.R. Holmes is 511-172 in 29 years at Bloomington South and 654-290 in 41 years of coaching. His 654 wins is the fourth-most on the active coaches wins list behind Pat Rady of Cloverdale (711), Bill Patrick of Tippecanoe Valley (677) and Jack Keefer of Lawrence North (669).
- Both Bloomington and Kokomo were among 15 charter members at the formation of the IHSAA in 1903. Other schools included Anderson, Alexandria, Eaton, Fairmount, Goshen, Huntington, Indianapolis Manual Training, Indianapolis Shortridge, Marion, Noblesville, North Manchester, Salem and Wabash.

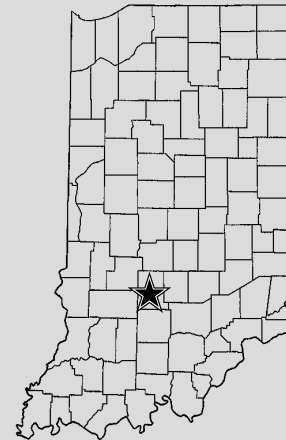

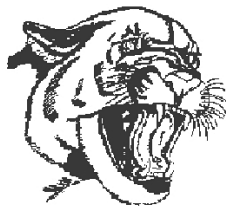

# Arthur L. Trester Mental Attitude Award Recipients

At the state finals, members of the IHSAA Executive Committee present the Trester Award to the outstanding senior participant in each classification of the boys' basketball state finals. The recipients of this award, who were nominated by their principals and coaches, must excel in mental attitude, scholarship, leadership and athletic ability in basketball. Farm Bureau Insurance, IHSAA corporate partner, presents a \$1,000 scholarship to each school in the name of the recipient.

From 1917 to 1943 the award was known as "The Gimbel Medal for Mental Attitude" in honor of Mr. Jake Gimbel of Vincennes, who awarded the medal each of those years until his passing prior to the 1943 tournament. In 1944, the award became known as the "IHSAA Medal for Mental Attitude". In 1945, the IHSAA board officially named the award "The Arthur L. Trester Medal for Mental Attitude" in honor of the man who served as first commissioner of the Association from 1929 to 1944.

Recipients were given a medal each year from 1945 through 1964, hence "The Arthur L. Trester Medal for Mental Attitude." Since 1965, the award has been made in the form of a plaque with a copy of the original medal incorporated on the face of the plaque, hence "The Arthur L. Trester Award for Mental Attitude."
