CREDENTIALS: The deadline for requests is Thursday, March 22, 4 pm ET / 3 pm CT. Credentials will not be granted after that time. For news media outlets intending to cover the boys basketball state finals, please apply for credentials by e-mailing your request (with name of individual applying) to IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at jwille@ihsaa.org. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, aol.com, gmail.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Approved requests will be available for pickup inside the media entrance on game day. Credentials will not be mailed.

MEDIA PARKING: There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are numerous parking options within a short distance of Bankers Life Fieldhouse. The Virginia Street parking garage, which charges a fee, is directly to the east of the venue.

MEDIA WILL-CALL/ENTRANCE: To gain admittance, the 2011-12 IHSAA Boys Basketball State Finals Media Credential is required. The entrance is on the southeast side of Bankers Life Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Credentials may be claimed beginning at 8 am ET for the first session and at 4 pm ET for the second session. Please have identification available and be prepared to have bags and equipment checked by security officials.

MEDIA WORKROOM: As in previous years, the media workroom at Bankers Life Fieldhouse will be open all day and be available to working media members. The work area contains complimentary wireless internet access. Soft drinks and snacks will be available.

BROADCAST PHONE LINES: Electronic media requiring phone line installation should contact Ira Maher of 360 Group for an order form as soon as possible. Maher may be reached at 317-633-1456 or via e-mail at ira@360grouponline.com.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS: Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used along press row.

RESULTS & STATISTICS: Live stats for each game will be available on the IHSAA website. Stats and box scores will be distributed at the end of each quarter on press row as well as in the media work room.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: No one except tournament workers and team members will have access to the inner hallways where locker rooms are located.

NO CHILDREN, PLEASE: With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

LIVE TELEVISION CUT-INS: Spot news reports showing live game action is prohibited. Stand-up reports for newscasts are permitted from inside the building provided that no live action is shown.

POST-GAME GUIDELINES

With the exception of the IHSAA's Radio, Television, Internet and Photography partners, all media members are asked to remain off the playing floor and behind the ropes during the post-game awards ceremonies.

The post-game ceremonies order will be as follows:

- Mental Attitude Award presentation
- Runner-Up medals and trophy presentation
- Championship medals and trophy presentation
- Team Photographs by Visual Sports Network

Following the Class A, 2A and 3A awards ceremonies, coaches and selected players will be escorted to the Media Interview Room for a formal press conference which is located on playing floor level just off the media entrance elevator. We ask your assistance to use the press conference as the appropriate time to conduct interviews. The runner-up team coach and selected players will go first followed by the championship team coach and players.

Because of newspaper deadline issues at the end of the 4A contest, no press conference will be scheduled and news media will be allowed to conduct interviews on and around the floor after the awards ceremonies. For those working on deadline, the IHSAA will distribute "quick quotes" in the media work room taken from the IHSAA Television and Radio Network interviews as soon as possible after the game.

Loogootee Lions

- Ranked #7 in AP Class A poll.
- Loogootee playing for its first state championship in any sport.
- Lions are making fourth appearance in boys basketball state finals overall and third time in the championship game (0-2 in previous final games in 1975, 2005).
- Ranks 10th in state in defense allowing opponents only 43.88 ppg.
- Avenged two of its four regular season losses -- Barr-Reeve, Orleans -- during tourney run.
- Rockville will be this team's fourth top 10 opponent this tournament. Lions have knocked off #1 Barr-Reeve in the sectional opener, #2 Edinburgh in the semi-state and #10 Orelans to win the regional crown.
- With its 55-30 victory over Shoals on March 3, school won its first sectional championship since that 2005 state runner-up season.
- Team is 12-3 vs. other Class A schools; 4-1 vs. 2A schools; 3-0 vs. 3A schools; 1-0 vs. 4A schools.
- Mike Wagoner is 66-23 in his fourth year as Loogootee head coach.
- Longtime former head coach Jack Butcher is state's all-time winningest coach with 806 victories. The Lions play their home games at Jack Butcher Arena.

Rockville Rox

- Ranked #6 in AP Class A poll.
- Rockville is playing in its first state finals since 1918 and fifth trip overall and first championship game appearance.
- The 94 years between its two trips is the longest span in state history. In 1918, Rockville was one of 20 teams to advance from sectional tournaments directly to the state finals (regional tourneys came about in 1921). That Rockville team lost its opening round game to Martinsville.
- Ranks 12th in state in defense allowing opponents only 43.89 ppg.
- Saturday's game against #7 Loogootee will be the second ranked foe team has faced this tournament; defeated #9 Fort Wayne Canterbury 63-58 in semi-state championship game.
- Defeated North Vermillion, 63-42, on March 3 to win its fourth sectional crown in five years.
- Defeated Union (Modoc) and Liberty Christian on March 10 to sew up second consecutive regional crown, the only two in school history.
- Team suffered four of its five season losses during holiday stretch but have won 14 of 15 to this point. Its fifth setback was in overtime to Terre Haute South in the regular season finale.
- Team is 14-1 vs. other Class A schools; 4-2 vs. 2A teams; 4-1 vs. 3A teams; 0-1 vs. 4A teams.
- Head coach Dave Mahurin, who also serves as school principal, is 140-78 in nine years at Rockville and 265-220 in 22 years overall.

Park Tudor Panthers

- Ranked #1 in AP Class 2A poll and #12 in single class IBCA poll.
- Park Tudor returns to Class 2A state championship game for third consecutive season after winning its first basketball title a year ago.
- Team returns 10 players from last year's championship team including eight who saw action in the final.
- Eighth school to make three consecutive state championship game appearances (Franklin, Indianapolis Attucks, Lafayette Central Catholic, Lawrence North, Marion, Martinsville, Pike).
- Rank 17th in state in defense allowing opponents only 45.4 ppg. Rank seventh in state in margin of victory at 19.2 ppg.
- Team is led by senior point guard Kevin "Yogi" Ferrell, one the nation's top seniors.
- Panthers fell to 4A state finalist Pike, 79-67, on Jan. 11.
- Head coach Ed Schilling is in his third season as coach (65-15). He is a former New Jersey Nets assistant coach and also spent six seasons as head coach at Wright State and has been an assistant coach at Memphis and UMass.
- Assistant coach April McDivitt was the 1999 Miss Basketball at Connersville HS.
- School is known for its tennis prowess with 13 of its 15 state championships split between its boys (7) and girls (6) programs.

Bowman Academy Eagles

- Ranked #5 in AP Class 2A poll.
- Bowman Academy playing in second state championship game in three years after winning the Class A title in 2010.
- Three players on this year's roster were part of that 2010 championship team including DeJuan Marrero (started in 2010), Michael Ford and Elijah Ray (both came in off bench).
- Ranks fourth in the state in scoring at 74.6 ppg.
- Bowman outscored #7 Tipton 27-14 in the second quarter of Saturday's 69-64 semi-state victory and overcame a 40-point, eight rebound effort from Tipton's Mike Crawford. Elijah Ray stepped up with 22 points for the Eagles.
- Eagles defeated #3 Hammond Bishop Noll, 77-58, on March 3 to win its third sectional championship in four seasons.
- Team is 7-0 vs. other 2A teams; 2-0 vs. 3A teams and 6-4 vs. 4A teams.



Arthur L. Trester Mental Attitude Award Recipients

At the state finals, members of the IHSAA Executive Committee present the Trester Award to the outstanding senior participant in each classification of the boys' basketball state finals. The recipients of this award, who were nominated by their principals and coaches, must excel in mental attitude, scholarship, leadership and athletic ability in basketball. Farm Bureau Insurance, IHSAA corporate partner, presents a \$1,000 scholarship to each school in the name of the recipient.

From 1917 to 1943 the award was known as "The Gimbel Medal for Mental Attitude" in honor of Mr. Jake Gimbel of Vincennes, who awarded the medal each of those years until his passing prior to the 1943 tournament. In 1944, the award became known as the "IHSAA Medal for Mental Attitude". In 1945, the IHSAA board officially named the award "The Arthur L. Trester Medal for Mental Attitude" in honor of the man who served as first commissioner of the Association from 1929 to 1944.

Recipients were given a medal each year from 1945 through 1964, hence "The Arthur L. Trester Medal for Mental Attitude." Since 1965, the award has been made in the form of a plaque with a copy of the original medal incorporated on the face of the plaque, hence "The Arthur L. Trester Award for Mental Attitude."
