Indianapolis Colts Unveil "Salute to High School Football" at Lucas Oil Stadium

Colts also extend state tournament sponsorship for three more years

This weekend, as high school football concludes with the state championship games, the Indianapolis Colts and the Indiana High School Athletic Association will unveil a new display in Lucas Oil Stadium. The "Salute to High School Football" display will be a permanent fixture in the southwest concourse area of the stadium. The display will feature helmets from nearly all of the 322 football programs in Indiana. The Colts and IHSAA have a long standing partnership and passion for developing football in the state of Indiana.

In addition to the "Salute to High School Football" display, the Colts have pledged to renew their sponsorship of the IHSAA Football State Tournament for the next three years. In 2009, the Colts became the first NFL franchise to sponsor a state football tournament.

About the Indiana High School Athletic Association, Inc. (IHSAA)

The IHSAA is a voluntary, not-for-profit organization that is self-supporting without the use of tax monies. Since its founding in 1903, the Association's mission has been to provide wholesome, educational athletics for the secondary schools of Indiana. Its member high schools - public, institutional, parochial and private - pay no annual membership fee or incur entry fees to play in the Association's tournaments. A state tournament series is conducted annually in 21 sports, 10 for girls, 10 for boys and one co-ed (unified track and field). A 19-person board of directors, elected by member school principals, governs the organization.
