CREDENTIALS: The deadline for requests is **Thursday, February 28, 4 pm ET/3 pm CT**. Credentials will not be granted after that time. For media outlets intending to cover the girls basketball state finals, please apply for credentials by e-mailing your request (with name of individual to be credentialed) to IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at jwille@ihsaa.org. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, aol.com, gmail.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Please note that the girls basketball state finals require a specific credential. Any passes issued previously will not allow admission to this event. Credentials will not be mailed.

MEDIA PARKING: All media parking will be in Lot D located directly across the street to the east of the Hulman Center at the corner of Ninth Street and Eagle Street. Please have business identification available for access.

MEDIA WILL-CALL/ENTRANCE: Approved credential requests will be available for pickup at media will-call located inside the lower level entrance at the base of the loading ramp on the north side of the venue. Credentials may be claimed beginning at 8 am ET for the first session and at 4 pm ET for the second session. Please have identification available and be prepared to have bags and equipment checked by security officials.

MEDIA WORK AREA: In addition to press row at courtside, the "Media Interview Room" located in the east tunnel will serve as a work place for media and also the location of the Class A, 2A and 3A press conferences. A hospitality area will also be available just off the northwest corner of the court.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS: Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used along press row.

WIRELESS INTERNET: Complimentary wireless internet access will be available.

RESULTS & STATISTICS: Both will be posted to the IHSAA website as soon as possible after the game. Stats and box scores will be distributed at the end of each quarter on press row as well as in the Media Interview Room.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: No one except tournament workers and team coaches and participants will have access to the locker rooms.

NO CHILDREN, PLEASE: With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

LIVE TELEVISION CUT-INS: Spot news reports showing live game action are prohibited. Stand-up reports for newscasts are permitted from inside the building provided that no live action is shown.

POST-GAME GUIDELINES

With the exception of the IHSAA's Radio, Television, Internet and Photography partners, all media members are asked to remain off the playing floor and behind the ropes during the post-game awards ceremonies.

The post-game ceremonies order will be as follows:

- Mental Attitude Award presentation
- Runner-Up medals and trophy presentation
- Championship medals and trophy presentation
- Team Photographs by Visual Sports Network

Following the Class A, 2A and 3A awards ceremonies, coaches and selected players will be escorted to the "Media Interview Room" in the east tunnel for a formal press conference which is located on playing floor level. We ask your assistance to use the press conference as the appropriate time to conduct interviews. The runner-up team coach and selected players will go first followed by the championship team coach and players.

Because of newspaper deadline issues at the end of the 4A contest, no press conference will be scheduled and news media will be allowed to conduct interviews on and around the floor after the awards ceremonies. For those working on deadline, the IHSAA will distribute "quick quotes" taken from the IHSAA Television and Radio Network interviews as soon as possible after the game.

Fort Wayne Canterbury Cavaliers

- Ranked #1 in ICGSA Class A poll and #16 in single class IBCA poll.
- Fort Wayne Canterbury is the defending Class A state champion. Cavaliers attempting to win fifth state championship in six seasons.
- School is 4-0 in previous state championship games including 2-0 vs. Vincennes Rivet (2009, 2010).
- One of three schools returning from 2012 state finals (Evansville Mater Dei, Mt. Vernon (Fortville)).
- Team returns four starters from last year's state title team.
- Cavaliers leading the state for the second straight year in scoring average (74.96 ppg) and 14th in margin of victory (22.78).
- Team won its 10th straight sectional title and sixth straight regional this year. Their regional streak ties a state record with Pike Central (1990-95) and NorthWood (1994-99).
- All three losses came to 4A teams including a 97-73 setback to state finalist Fort Wayne South Side on Nov. 28. Beat Class A #2 Oregon-Davis, 79-54, to win regional crown.
- Coach is Wayne Kreiger, in his first year as Canterbury girls coach after taking over for son Scott who became Canterbury boys coach. Was longtime Columbia City girls coach compiling 520-222 record in 34 years and taking team to 2000 3A state runner-up finish. Was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006.
- Cavaliers looking for second state title this school year. Boys soccer team won its second straight Class A title on Oct. 27.

- Ranked #4 in ICGSA Class A poll.
- Vincennes Rivet playing in fourth Class A title game in five years and looking for its second state championship in three seasons.
- Patriots to face #1 Fort Wayne Canterbury in final for third time (2009, 2010), 0-2 in previous games.
- Rivet defeated three consecutive top 10 opponents during tournament - beat #10 Barr-Reeve, 60-47, to win sectional, #8 New Washington, 56-42, and #5 Northeast Dubois, 53-39, to win regional.
- After losing its only four games of season during six game stretch in December, Patriots have won 13 straight games to reach state championship game.
- Each of its losses came to 3A and 2A teams including a 67-54 loss to 2A state finalist Evansville Mater Dei on Dec. 19 and 75-46 setback to 2A semi-state participant Heritage Christian on Dec. 28.
- 14-0 vs. other Class A schools, 5-2 vs. 2A schools, 3-2 vs. 3A schools.
- Patriots finished 8-0 to win Blue Chip Conference this season.
- Between Rivet and Northeast Dubois, the Blue Chip Conference has produced five consecutive 1A state finalist teams.
- Built in 1925, Rivet Gymnasium is the second oldest high school gym in the state of Indiana still in use (The Cave, Mishawaka, 1924).

Eastern Comets

- Ranked tied for #6 in 2A ICGSA poll.
- Eastern (Greentown) making its first appearance in girls basketball state finals and will face top-ranked defending state champion Evansville Mater Dei.
- Mater Dei will be the first ranked team Eastern has faced this tournament.
- Comets won their second sectional and regional crowns in school history this year (1999) and first semi-state title.
- Defeated 2012 state runner-up and perennial power Fort Wayne Bishop Luers in the semi-state game, 74-55.
- One of two Mid-Indiana Conference teams participating in the state finals (3A Hamilton Heights). Comets finished third in this year's conference race.
- Each of Eastern's three losses came to in-conference 3A teams, Hamilton Heights and twice to Western.
- 16-0 vs. other 2A teams; 3-3 vs. 3A teams; 1-0 vs. 4A teams.
- Brittany Neeley accounted for 48 points (32 in second half) and 20 rebounds in the semi-state victory over Luers. She finished 19-21 from the line. Her 48 points was the most ever scored in a girls semi-state game and tied for fourth-most in state tournament history. She combined with twin sister Bethany for 64 points and 32 rebounds in the game.
- Bethany Neeley won the IHSAA 1600 meter run state championship last June in Bloomington and is a three-time state finalists in track and field and cross country. Brittany is a three-time state finalist in track and two-time finalist in cross country.

- Wildcats won their first regional, semi-state and state championship a year ago.
- Mater Dei ranks 10th in state regardless of class in points per game (65.24) and seventh in margin of victory (24.59).
- One of three schools returning from 2012 state finals (Fort Wayne Canterbury, Mt. Vernon (Fortville)).
- Only two losses this season came at the hands of 4A teams including to #1 Columbus North 63-55 in the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame championship game on Dec. 28.

Hamilton Heights Huskies

- Ranked #2 in 3A ICGSA poll.
- Hamilton Heights making its first girls basketball state finals appearance and seeking school's first state championship (team or individual) in any sport.
- This is the just the second state finals appearance by a Hamilton Heights team in any sport coming on the heels of the football team's 3A state runner-up finish over Thanksgiving weekend.
- Saturday's game will be a rematch of the Nov. 21 contest the Huskies won at Mt. Vernon, 70-61.
- Hamilton Heights won its second straight sectional this year and third overall and proceeded to capture its first regional and semi-state championships.
- Hamilton Heights facing their third top six opponent in four games in #6 Mt. Vernon. Defeated #5 Norwell, 60-58 in the regional and #4 Benton Central, 69-58, to win semi-state.
- Huskies rank second in state, regardless of class, in scoring average (69.4 ppg) and 13th in margin of victory (23.28).
- 14-0 vs. other 3A schools this season, 4-2 vs. 4A schools.
- Between 2004 and 2011, Hamilton Heights and Mt. Vernon began their tournament trails in the same 3A sectional.
- One of two Mid-Indiana Conference teams participating in the state finals (2A Eastern (Greentown)).
