CREDENTIALS: The deadline for requests is **Thursday, March 5, 4 pm ET/3 pm CT**. Credentials will not be granted after that time. For media outlets intending to cover the girls basketball state finals, please apply for credentials by e-mailing your request (with name of individual to be credentialed) to IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at jwille@ihsaa.org. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, aol.com, gmail.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Please note that the girls basketball state finals require a specific credential. Any passes issued previously will not allow admission to this event. Credentials will not be mailed.

MEDIA PARKING: There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are numerous parking options within a short distance of Bankers Life Fieldhouse. The Virginia Street parking garage, which charges a fee, is directly to the east of the venue.

MEDIA WILL-CALL/ENTRANCE: To gain admittance, the 2014-15 IHSAA Girls Basketball State Finals Media Credential is required. The entrance is on the southeast side of Bankers Life Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Credentials may be claimed beginning at 8 am ET for the first session and at 4 pm ET for the second session. Please have identification available and be prepared to have bags and equipment checked by security officials.

MEDIA WORKROOM: The media workroom at Bankers Life Fieldhouse will be open all day and be available to working media members. The work area contains complimentary wireless internet access and hospitality will be available.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS: Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used along press row.

BROADCAST PHONE LINES: Electronic media requiring phone line installation should contact Ira Maher of 360 Group for an order form as soon as possible. Maher may be reached at 317-633-1456 or via e-mail at ira@360grouponline.com.

WIRELESS ACCESS: Complimentary wireless service is provided for all attending media. Instructions are posted inside the media workroom. RESULTS & STATISTICS: Live stats for each game will be available on the IHSAA website. Stats and box scores will be distributed at the end of each quarter on press row as well as in the media work room.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: No one except tournament workers and team coaches and participants will have access to the locker rooms.

NO CHILDREN, PLEASE: With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

LIVE TELEVISION CUT-INS: Spot news reports showing live game action are prohibited. Stand-up reports for newscasts are permitted from inside the building provided that no live action is shown.

POST-GAME GUIDELINES

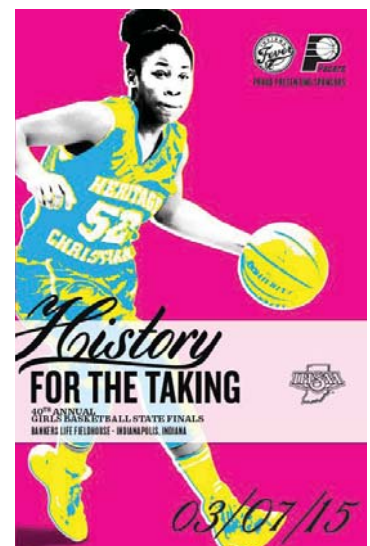
With the exception of the IHSAA's Radio, Television, Internet and Photography partners, all media members are asked to remain off the playing floor and behind the ropes during the post-game awards ceremonies.

The post-game ceremonies order will be as follows:

- Mental Attitude Award presentation
- Runner-Up medals and trophy presentation
- Championship medals and trophy presentation
- Team Photographs by Visual Sports Network

Following the Class A, 2A and 3A awards ceremonies, coaches and selected players will be escorted to the Media Interview Room for a formal press conference which is located on playing floor level just off the media entrance elevator. We ask your assistance to use the press conference as the appropriate time to conduct interviews. The runner-up team coach and selected players will go first followed by the championship team coach and players.

Because of newspaper deadline issues at the end of the 4A contest, no press conference will be scheduled and news media will be allowed to conduct interviews on and around the floor after the awards ceremonies.

- Lafayette Central Catholic making second state finals appearance and first since 2006 championship season.
- Knights rallied from eight point deficit over the last 50.7 seconds outscoring defending state champion Oregon-Davis 11-0 during that span to win semi-state crown. Central Catholic had lost to Oregon-Davis in the semi-state last year.
- Team finding inspiration from assistant coach Jeff Dienhart, 44, who passed away last Wednesday after a long battle with illnesses caused by cystic fibrosis.
- Team has won 14 of its last 15 games.

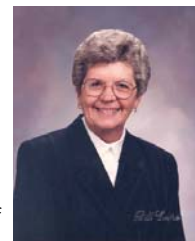
Patricia L. Roy Mental Attitude Award Recipients
