PUBLIC ENTRANCE: The public may enter from Pennsylvania Street or Delaware Street into the lobby on the north side of Bankers Life Fieldhouse. Ticket office windows are located there.

GATES OPEN: Bankers Life Fieldhouse will open its gates to fans beginning one hour prior to the start of each session -- 9:30 am ET and 5 pm ET. The venue will be cleared between the Class 2A and 3A games.

LOCATION & PARKING: Bankers Life Fieldhouse is located in downtown Indianapolis at 125 S. Pennsylvania Street, Indianapolis, IN 46204. There are multiple parking options throughout the downtown area that are within walking distance of the Fieldhouse. The Virginia Avenue Garage, which charges a fee and is located directly to the east of the venue, connects to the Fieldhouse from the third floor of the garage via a walkway over Delaware Street. The entrance to the Virginia Avenue Garage is located off of Maryland Street.

CREDENTIALS: The deadline for requests is **Thursday, March 24, 4 pm ET / 3 pm CT**. Credentials will not be granted after that time. For news media outlets intending to cover the boys basketball state finals, please apply for credentials by e-mailing your request (with name of individual applying) to IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at jwille@ihsaa.org. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, aol.com, gmail.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Approved requests will be available for pickup inside the media entrance on game day. Credentials will not be mailed.

MEDIA PARKING: There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are multiple parking options throughout the downtown area that are within walking distance of the Fieldhouse. The Virginia Avenue Garage, which charges a fee and is located directly to the east of the venue, connects to the Fieldhouse from the third floor of the garage via a walkway over Delaware Street. The entrance to the Virginia Avenue Garage is located off of Maryland Street.

MEDIA WILL-CALL/ENTRANCE: To gain admittance, the 2015-16 IHSAA Boys Basketball State Finals Media Credential is required. The entrance is on the southeast side of Bankers Life Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Credentials may be claimed beginning at 8 am ET for the first session and at 4 pm ET for the second session. Please have identification available and be prepared to have bags and equipment checked by security officials.

MEDIA WORKROOM: The media workroom at Bankers Life Fieldhouse will be open all day and be available to working media members. The work area contains complimentary wireless internet access and hospitality will be available.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS: Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used along press row.

BROADCAST PHONE LINES: For phone line installation, please complete the [IHSAA Broadcast Application](#).

WIRELESS ACCESS, ETHERNET LINES: Complimentary wireless service is provided for all attending media. Instructions are posted inside the media workroom. In order to maintain the strength of the Bankers Life Fieldhouse "Fieldhouse Wifi" wireless signal, personal hotspots and "mi-fi" devices should be turned off. Signals from these devices will be systematically saturated such that connection will be unachievable. This is done solely for the stability, strength and usability of the free signal provided to enhance the fan experience for everyone. A successful broadcast signal will require use of the complimentary "Fieldhouse Wifi" signal, a dedicated phone line or a hard-wired Ethernet line. RESULTS & STATISTICS: Live stats for each game will be available on the IHSAA website. Stats and box scores will be distributed between quarters and and post-game as well as in the media work room.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: No one except tournament workers and team members will have access to the inner hallways where locker rooms are located.

NO CHILDREN, PLEASE: With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

LIVE TELEVISION CUT-INS: Spot news reports showing live game action is prohibited. Stand-up reports for newscasts are permitted from inside the building provided that no live action is shown.

POST-GAME GUIDELINES

With the exception of the IHSAA's Radio, Television, Internet and Photography partners, all media members are asked to remain off the playing floor and behind the ropes during the post-game awards ceremonies.

The post-game ceremonies order will be as follows:

- Mental Attitude Award presentation
- Runner-Up medals and trophy presentation
- Championship medals and trophy presentation
- Team Photographs by Visual Sports Network

Following the Class A, 2A and 3A awards ceremonies, coaches and selected players will be escorted to the Media Interview Room for a formal press conference which is located on playing floor level just off the media entrance elevator. We ask your assistance to use the press conference as the appropriate time to conduct interviews. The runner-up team coach and selected players will go first followed by the championship team coach and players.

Because of newspaper deadline issues at the end of the 4A contest, no press conference will be scheduled and news media will be allowed to conduct interviews on and around the floor after the awards ceremonies.

- Giants are making their 21st appearance in the boys basketball state finals, third-most in state history behind Anderson and Muncie Central with 24 trips each.
- One of two North Central Conference teams in this year's state finals (McCutcheon). Arthur L. Trester & Ray Craft Mental Attitude Award Recipients

The IHSAA Executive Committee presents the Arthur L. Trester & Ray Craft Mental Attitude Awards to the outstanding senior participant in each classification of the boys' basketball state finals. The recipients of these awards, who were nominated by their principals and coaches, must excel in mental attitude, scholarship, leadership and athletic ability in basketball. The Indiana Pacers and Indiana Fever, the presenting sponsors of the state tournament, donate a \$1,000 scholarship to each school in the name of the recipient.

The 4A, 3A and 2A awards are named in honor of the late Arthur L. Trester who served as first commissioner of the Association from 1929 to 1944. Trester helped Indiana high school sports and the IHSAA emerge from the Great Depression in a position of preeminence unmatched by perhaps any other state in the nation.

Beginning in 2016, the Class A award has been re-named in honor of Ray Craft, the long-time associate commissioner who served from 1983 to 2008. Craft was involved at nearly every level of Indiana secondary education and interscholastic athletics during his career including administering the boys basketball state tournament for many years. He was also a starting senior guard on Milan High School's 1954 state championship basketball team.

From 1917 to 1943 the award was known as "The Gimbel Medal for Mental Attitude" in honor of Mr. Jake Gimbel of Vincennes, who awarded the medal each of those years until his passing prior to the 1943 tournament. In 1944, the award became known as the "IHSAA Medal for Mental Attitude". In 1945, the IHSAA Board officially named the award "The Arthur L. Trester Medal for Mental Attitude".

Recipients were given a medal each year from 1945 through 1964, hence "The Arthur L. Trester Medal for Mental Attitude." Since 1965, the award has been made in the form of a plaque with a copy of the original medal incorporated on the face of the plaque, hence "The Arthur L. Trester Award for Mental Attitude."
