**CREDENTIALS:** The deadline for requests is Thursday, March 22, 4 pm ET/3 pm CT. Credentials will not be granted after that time. For media outlets intending to cover the boys basketball state finals, please apply for credentials by e-mailing your request (with name of individual to be credentialled) to IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at [jwille@ihsaa.org](mailto:jwille@ihsaa.org). E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, aol.com, gmail.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Please note that the boys basketball state finals require a specific credential. Any passes issued previously will not allow admission to this event. Credentials will not be mailed.

**NO CHILDREN, PLEASE:** With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

**MEDIA PARKING:** There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are multiple parking options throughout the downtown area that are within walking distance of the Fieldhouse. The Virginia Avenue Garage, which charges a fee and is located directly to the east of the venue, connects to the Fieldhouse from the third floor of the garage via a walkway over Delaware Street. The entrance to the Virginia Avenue Garage is located off of Maryland Street.

**MEDIA WILL-CALL/ENTRANCE:** To gain admittance, the 2017-18 IHSAA Boys Basketball State Finals Media Credential is required. The entrance is on the southeast side of Bankers Life Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Credentials may be claimed beginning at 8 am ET for the first session and at 4 pm ET for the second session. Please have identification available and be prepared to have bags and equipment checked by security officials.

**MEDIA WORKROOM:** The media workroom at Bankers Life Fieldhouse will be open all day and be available to working media members. The work area contains complimentary wireless internet access and hospitality will be available.

**SEAT ASSIGNMENTS:** Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used along press row.

**FIELDHOUSE WIFI:** Complimentary wireless service is provided for all attending media. Please access the "BLF Wifi" wireless signal. No login or password is required. *Some older devices (2.4 GHz) may not be able to access this 5.0 GHz signal.* A successful broadcast connection will require use of the complimentary "BLF Wifi" signal, a dedicated phone line or a hard-wired Ethernet line. **RESULTS & STATISTICS:** Live stats for each game will be available on the IHSAA website. Stats and box scores will be distributed at the end of each quarter on press row as well as in the media work room.

**LOCKER ROOM ACCESS:** No one except tournament workers and team coaches and participants will have access to the locker rooms.

**LIVE TELEVISION CUT-INS:** News reports showing live game action are prohibited. Stand-up reports for newscasts are permitted from inside the building provided that no live action is shown.

#### POST-GAME GUIDELINES

With the exception of the IHSAA's Radio, Television, Internet and Photography partners, all media members are asked to remain off the playing floor and behind the ropes during the post-game awards ceremonies.

The post-game ceremonies order will be as follows:

- Mental Attitude Award presentation
- Runner-Up medals and trophy presentation
- Championship medals and trophy presentation
- Team Photographs by Champions Illustrated

Following the Class A, 2A and 3A awards ceremonies, coaches and selected players will be escorted to the Media Interview Room for a formal press conference which is located on playing floor level just off the media entrance elevator. We ask your assistance to use the press conference as the appropriate time to conduct interviews. The runner-up team's coach and selected players will go first followed by the championship team's coach and players.

Because of newspaper deadlines at the end of the 4A contest, no press conference will be scheduled and news media will be allowed to conduct interviews on and around the floor after the awards ceremonies.



**NFHS' BOB GARDNER NAMED RICHARD G. LUGAR AWARD RECIPIENT**

Executive Director of the NFHS, Bob Gardner, is the second annual recipient of the Richard G. Lugar Award for Distinguished Service to Interscholastic Athletics.

At halftime of the 4A state championship game on Saturday night, IHSAA Commissioner Bobby Cox, Jim Morris, Vice Chairman of Pacers Sports and Entertainment, and Governor Eric Holcomb will present the award to Bob Gardner.



After committing to a career in secondary education that has spanned 48 years, Gardner will be retiring this August from his work that has impacted high schools in both local Indiana communities and across the country. A three-sport athlete at Boonville High School, Gardner spent his entire career in Indiana while having an impact and awareness on a national level. A principal and superintendent in the Milan Community School system, Gardner joined the IHSAA staff as an Assistant Commissioner in 1985, and was later appointed Commissioner of the Association in 1995.

Joining the National Federation of State High School Associations in 2000, Gardner later assumed the role of Executive Director in 2010, and has since led the organization's focus on risk minimization in high school sports, with particular emphasis on concussion awareness. He has brought a heightened national presence to the work of the NFHS and its member state associations.

A Hoosier legend, Gardner obtained his undergraduate degree from the University of Evansville, and attended Ball State University for his master's and Ed.S degree. He is a member of the Indiana High School Wrestling Hall of Fame, and has also served on the Board of Directors for USA Football, USA Basketball, and the Indiana Sports Corporation.

## FRANKLIN'S GARY HAMILTON TO BE HONORED AS BASKETBALL'S OUTSTANDING OFFICIAL

Each year, the Indiana High School Athletic Association honors an outstanding official in each sport during the State Final Tournament.

Gary Hamilton, of Franklin, is the recipient of the 2017-18 IHSAA

Outstanding Basketball Official Award.

As a member of the Indiana Officials Association, Gary has been a licensed basketball

official for the past 37 years where he has served as Basketball Chairperson for his association. During his career, he's officiated 30 basketball sectional championships, 23 regionals, eight semi-states, and four state finals. In addition, Gary is a licensed football and baseball official, and he has refereed the state finals for both girls basketball and football as well (three girls basketball finals and three football finals).

Gary was selected for this honor by a committee representing the official's associations.

In Indiana, there are 24 associations made up of more than men and women who assist in providing wholesome, worthwhile, and healthy activities for the student-athletes in our state. Statewide, there are more than 8,000 officials licensed by the IHSAA in 11 sports.

A 1978 graduate of Indian Creek High School, Gary is a sporting goods sales rep at The Winning Edge in Rochester. He is very active in his community, serving as an official for the Franklin Boys Club since 1982, and also working as a volunteer official at the Outdoor Games for the Greenwood Parks Department. Gary and his wife have been married for 17 years. He has three children – Erin (37), Brooke (31), and Sara (31).

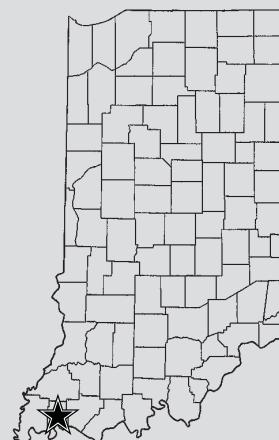

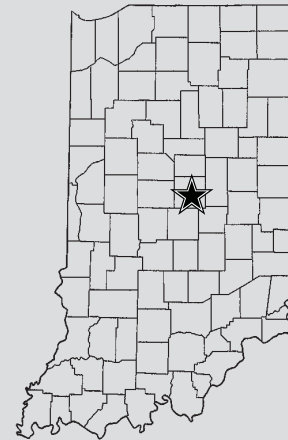

# ARTHUR L. TRESTER & RAY CRAFT MENTAL ATTITUDE AWARD RECIPIENTS

The IHSAA Executive Committee presents the Arthur L. Trestler & Ray Craft Mental Attitude Awards to the outstanding senior participant in each classification of the boys' basketball state finals. The recipients of these awards, who were nominated by their principals and coaches, must excel in mental attitude, scholarship, leadership and athletic ability in basketball. The Indiana Pacers and Indiana Fever, the presenting sponsors of the state tournament, donate a \$1,000 scholarship to each school in the name of the recipient.

The 4A, 3A and 2A awards are named in honor of the late Arthur L. Trestler who served as first commissioner of the Association from 1929 to 1944. Trestler helped Indiana high school sports and the IHSAA emerge from the Great Depression in a position of preeminence unmatched by perhaps any other state in the nation.

Beginning in 2016, the Class A award was re-named in honor of Ray Craft, the long-time associate commissioner who served from 1983 to 2008. Craft was involved at nearly every level of Indiana secondary education and interscholastic athletics during his career including administering the boys basketball state tournament for many years. He was also a starting senior guard on Milan High School's 1954 state championship basketball team.

From 1917 to 1943 the award was known as "The Gimbel Medal for Mental Attitude" in honor of Mr. Jake Gimbel of Vincennes, who awarded the medal each of those years until his passing prior to the 1943 tournament. In 1944, the award became known as the "IHSAA Medal for Mental Attitude". In 1945, the IHSAA Board officially named the award "The Arthur L. Trestler Medal for Mental Attitude".

Recipients were given a medal each year from 1945 through 1964, hence "The Arthur L. Trestler Medal for Mental Attitude." Since 1965, the award has been made in the form of a plaque with a copy of the original medal incorporated on the face of the plaque, hence "The Arthur L. Trestler Award for Mental Attitude."
