CREDENTIALS: The deadline for requests is Thursday, February 22, 4 pm ET/3 pm CT. Credentials will not be granted after that time. For media outlets intending to cover the girls basketball state finals, please apply for credentials by e-mailing your request (with name of individual to be credentialed) to IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at jwille@ihsaa.org. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, aol.com, gmail.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Please note that the girls basketball state finals require a specific credential. Any passes issued previously will not allow admission to this event. Credentials will not be mailed.

NO CHILDREN, PLEASE: With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

MEDIA PARKING: There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are multiple parking options throughout the downtown area that are within walking distance of the Fieldhouse. The Virginia Avenue Garage, which charges a fee and is located directly to the east of the venue, connects to the Fieldhouse from the third floor of the garage via a walkway over Delaware Street. The entrance to the Virginia Avenue Garage is located off of Maryland Street.

MEDIA WILL-CALL/ENTRANCE: To gain admittance, the 2017-18 IHSAA Girls Basketball State Finals Media Credential is required. The entrance is on the southeast side of Bankers Life Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Credentials may be claimed beginning at 8 am ET for the first session and at 4 pm ET for the second session. Please have identification available and be prepared to have bags and equipment checked by security officials.

MEDIA WORKROOM: The media workroom at Bankers Life Fieldhouse will be open all day and be available to working media members. The work area contains complimentary wireless internet access and hospitality will be available.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS: Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used along press row.

FIELDHOUSE WIFI: Complimentary wireless service is provided for all attending media. Please access the "BLF Wifi" wireless signal. A successful broadcast connection will require use of the complimentary "BLF Wifi" signal, a dedicated phone line or a hard-wired Ethernet line. RESULTS & STATISTICS: Live stats for each game will be available on the IHSAA website. Stats and box scores will be distributed at the end of each quarter on press row as well as in the media work room.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: No one except tournament workers and team coaches and participants will have access to the locker rooms.

LIVE TELEVISION CUT-INS: News reports showing live game action are prohibited. Stand-up reports for newscasts are permitted from inside the building provided that no live action is shown.

POST-GAME GUIDELINES

With the exception of the IHSAA's Radio, Television, Internet and Photography partners, all media members are asked to remain off the playing floor and behind the ropes during the post-game awards ceremonies.

The post-game ceremonies order will be as follows:

- Mental Attitude Award presentation
- Runner-Up medals and trophy presentation
- Championship medals and trophy presentation
- Team Photographs by Champions Illustrated

Following the Class A, 2A and 3A awards ceremonies,

coaches and selected players will be escorted to the Media Interview Room for a formal press conference which is located on playing floor level just off the media entrance elevator. We ask your assistance to use the press conference as the appropriate time to conduct interviews. The runner-up team's coach and selected players will go first followed by the championship team's coach and players.

Because of newspaper deadlines at the end of the 4A contest, no press conference will be scheduled and news media will be allowed to conduct interviews on and around the floor after the awards ceremonies.

TERRE HAUTE'S MARK HOPPER TO BE HONORED AS BASKETBALL'S OUTSTANDING OFFICIAL

Indiana recognizes 24 separate officials associations across the state. Each year these 24 associations nominate multiple individuals for the Outstanding Official Award presented in each sport. While we have many deserving nominations, only one is selected by his or her officiating peers.

An active member and Past President of the Wabash Valley Officials' Association, Mark Hopper has held a basketball officiating license for the past 22 years. In the sport of girls' basketball, Hopper has



officiated 19 sectionals, 13 regionals, six semi-states, and five state finals including last years' 3A championship game at Bankers Life Fieldhouse.

In addition to Mark's work as a basketball official, he is also a state level football and baseball official working on behalf of our student-athletes for the past 17 and 15 years, respectively.

Off the court, Mark serves as an IHSAA clinician and leader within our officiating ranks. He continues to be instrumental in the recruitment, mentoring and training of officials in Indiana. His level of commitment to his craft has proven to benefit countless officials, not just within his own Association, but across the entire State of Indiana.






